Instead, WSU came on to score 27 unanswered points to put the game away.

The Cougars fueled their offensive fire with the option play.

Williams took a pitch on the option and skirted the outside for a 22-yard touchdown run, giving the Cougars a 19-7 advantage. WSU followed later with a mix of option and pass plays on an 80-yard drive that put them up 26-7 with 1:17 left in the third period.

When injuries hit the Oregon defense, WSU was able to take advantage of the less-experienced replacements in the game for the Ducks. Gordon Bledsoe, Mike Walter and Steve Johnson all went down in the game, and the Cougars were able to chalk up an additional 13 points before it was all over.

The season begins to wind down this week as the Ducks prepare to go to Palo Alto, Calif. to take on Stanford. The Cardinals have been scoring a lot of points lately and if offensive trends continue for both the Ducks and the Cardinals, Oregon may have to wait until the Civil War game for another chance for a win.

Oregon gains experience at tourney

The good news for the Oregon volleyball team was that it gained experience against some of the best teams in the nation during last weekend's UCLA Invitational in Los Angeles.

The bad news was that the Ducks dropped all five matches they played, including a quick but merciful 2-15, 3-15 loss to the host Bruins.

The Ducks also lost to Cal-Fullerton, 11-15,

15-8, 10-15; Cal-Poly SLO, 6-15, 11-15; Stanford, 12-15, 14-16; and Kentucky, 10-15, 15-13, 13-15.

Coach Chris Voelz could find some consolation in playing against some of the best clubs around. "We came close to beating Stanford," she said. "We did some real good things and their coach came up to me after the match and said we are the most improved team around."

S.F. tips Atlanta, Seattle tops Steelers

Joe Montana threw a pair of touchdown passes, and an interception by Dwight Hicks thwarted a late Atlanta drive, enabling the San Francisco

49ers to win their seventh straight game, 17-14, over the Falcons Sunday.

The victory boosted San Francisco's record to 8-2 and gave the 49ers a three-game lead over Atlanta and the Los Angeles Rams, both 5-5, in the National Conference West Division.

Montana's second touchdown pass of the game, a 3-yarder to tight end Charle Young, gave the 49ers a 17-7 halftime lead.

With one last chance to win, Hicks, a safety, picked off a Bartkowski pass intended for Junior Miller at the 49ers 5-yard line, preserving the victory.

In other games, Minnesota whipped Tampa Bay 25-10, Houston edged Oakland 17-16, Green Bay edged the New York Giants 26-24, Philadelphia trounced St. Louis 52-10, Washington outlasted Detroit 33-31 and Miami beat New England 30-27 in overtime.

Also, Chicago edged Kansas City 16-13 in overtime, the N.Y. Jets thrashed Baltimore 41-14, Seattle trimmed Pittsburgh 24-21, New Orleans surprised Los Angeles 21-13, Cincinnati clobbered San Diego 40-17 and Denver downed Cleveland 23-20 in overtime.
