University Museum of Art
 Small-scale porcelain sculptures highlight the four new exhibits which open Sunday at the University Museum of Art. Still-life paintings, architectural projects and hand-colored photographs will also be displayed in separate showings through Dec. 20. Richard Notkin, a nationally recognized ceramic sculptor and teacher, will exhibit his porcelain miniatures in the first floor gallery. The work of Lynda Lanker, a Eugene painter in oils and watercolors, will also be displayed in the first floor gallery. It is her first one-person exhibition of still-life paintings. Also displayed in the main floor galleries will be architectural design projects submitted for competition by members of the Southwest Oregon Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. Each entry will include a series of 40 x 40-inch panels of photographs and drawings of structures ranging from single family dwellings to large commercial buildings.
