NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR PRELIMINARY PERMIT
(November 10, 1981)
Take notice that Springfield Utility Board (Applicant) filed on October 15, 1981, an application for preliminary permit (pursuant to the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. ss791(a)-825(r)) for Project No. 5502 to be known as the Cottage Grove Power Project located on the Willamette River (Cottage Grove Lake) in Lane County, near Cottage Grove, Oregon. The application is on file with the Commission and is available for public inspection. Correspondence with the Applicant should be directed to: Mr. Steve L. Project Description - The proposed project would be located at the base of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' existing Cottage Grove Lake Dam and would consist of: (1) a new outlet structure; (2) a penstock; (3) a powerhouse with a rated capacity of 1.4 MW; and (4) and 500-foot long, 115-kV transmission line to connect to an existing Pacific Power and Light Company line.

Proposed Scope of Studies under Permit - A preliminary permit, if issued, does not authorize construction. The Applicant is seeking a 26-month preliminary permit to study the feasibility of construction and operating the proposed project. No new road construction would be required to conduct the studies.

Competing Applications - This application was filed as a competing application to the Cottage Grove Hydroelectric Power Project No. 5024 filed on June 30, 1981, by Energenics Systems, Inc. under 18 C.F.R. s4.32 (1980). 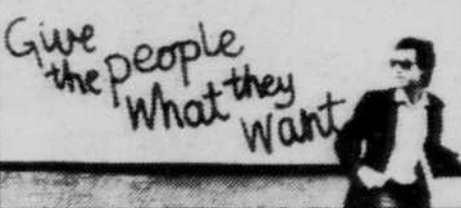
