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State student lobby hires new legislative assistant

A former legislative director of the United States Student Association was hired as legislative assistant by the Oregon Student Lobby last week.

Eduardo Wolle, 27, was selected from 104 applicants to replace John

Moore, now ASUO executive coordinator, says ASUO Pres. Rich Wilkins, board of directors chair of the Salem-based lobby.

"I wanted to stay within the field of representing students," says Wolle, currently a Washington, D.C. resident, about his decision to apply for the Oregon position.

"He'll be able to start in special session as soon as he gets around and meets people," Wilkins says, adding that Wolle should start his duties in January.

His first priority is finding out what the lobby's goals are, Wolle says, although his main concern is the higher education budget.

"He will have to deal with trying to get us more funding or making sure we don't get any more taken away," Wilkins says, adding that budget cuts that directly affect students will be targeted by the lobby.

The financial situation of Oregon's higher education system is "deja vu" to him, Wolle says, since Vermont already has made substantial cuts in higher education funding.

Elimination of program duplication and raising tuition costs were goals of budget-cutters in Vermont, and the "total effect isn't over there," Wolle says.

"He has good research abilities," Wilkins says of Wolle, who was an unsuccessful 1978 candidate for the Maryland legislature.

Wolle has "nationwide contacts" and knows "people that are doing interesting things all over the country," he says. The lobby will become even more visible and more credible with Wolle, Wilkins adds.

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
