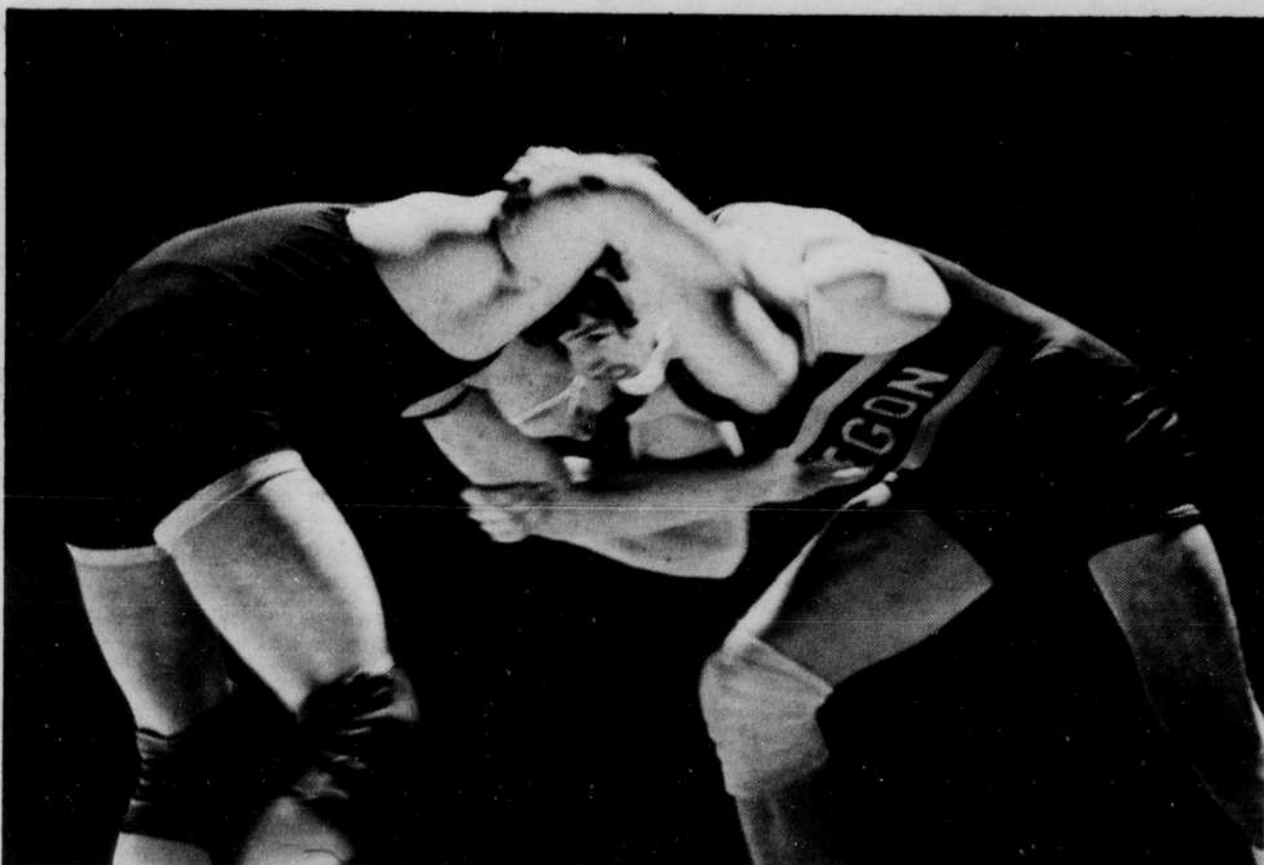




Oregon Wrestler Cliff Porter tangles with HSU's Dave Navarre in 11-3 decision for Duck senior Wednesday night.

Oregon pounds Humboldt

Duck wrestlers blank opponents 47-0 in opener

Heavyweight Dan Cook and 190-pound sophomore Lance Hohanadel finished off Humboldt State with back-to-back pins Wednesday night as the Oregon wrestlers rolled to an easy 47-0 dual meet victory at Mac Court.

Cook wasted little time putting Humboldt's Joe Kaminski to the mat, pinning the junior just 1:11 into the match after jumping to a quick 8-2 lead.

The enthusiastic Cub Scout Night crowd had barely settled down after intermission when Hohanadel dealt a painful blow to Humboldt's Paul White, pinning him with 52 seconds left in the opening round, and sending him to the locker room with what appeared to be a shoulder injury.

It was a nice way for the

Ducks to open up dual meet competition after posting a 22-3 mark last year. This meet was never in doubt.

Senior Randy Ohta got things going for the Ducks with a come-from-behind 13-7 decision over Humboldt's Joe Casterna at 118. Ohta fell behind 4-0 early on a takedown and a nearfall before scoring six straight points to take command in his first match of the season.

Senior Cliff Porter added to the Oregon cause at 134 with an 11-3 win over HSU's Dave Navarre. Porter did his damage in the second round with a reversal, takedown and escape.

In a bloody (noses) match at 142 pounds, Oregon's Randy O'Shea dealt Humboldt's Todd Owens an 11-2 blow. O'Shea had his foe breathing hard in the final round as the Duck picked up six points, raising the team score to 14-0.

Duck senior Bill Nugent collected a forfeit win at 150 collecting it 20-0, then Rick O'Shea picked up his fourth win with an 9-3 decision over Humboldt freshman Mike Blum.

The older O'Shea (a sophomore) was never challenged as Blum resorted to stalling tactics to avoid a fall.

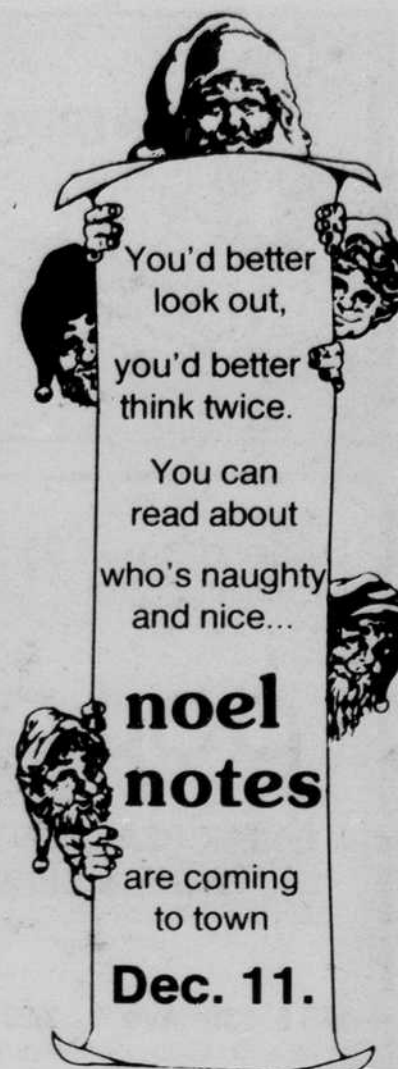
Women to battle Irvine in tourney

After four non-counting games, the Oregon women's basketball team finally begins playing for keeps when they open play in today's eight-team California Invitational at Berkeley.

The Ducks, currently ranked 13th in the nation, meet the University of California-Irvine in a 1:30 p.m. contest.

"This will be a good tournament, a good early test for our team," said Oregon coach Elwin Heiny who begins his sixth year as the Ducks' coach. "It'll tell us where we're at in our progress, and what we need to work on."

If Oregon wins today, ASU will likely be their semi-final opponent in Friday's 6 p.m. match-up.



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
