NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR PRELIMINARY PERMIT
 (November 12, 1981)

Take notice that Hydro Dyne Company (Applicant) filed on October 21, 1981 an application for preliminary permit (pursuant to the Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. ss791(a)-825(r)) for Project No. 5552 to be known as the Black Canyon Water Power Project located on Lake Waldo, and using the waters of North Fork of Middle Fork of the Willamette River, Black and Salmon Creeks in Lane County near Oakridge, Oregon. The application is on file with the Commission and is available for public inspection. Correspondence with the Applicant should be directed to Messrs. Brad Mowreader, Frank Mowreader, 2100 West Broadway #8, Eugene, Oregon 97402.

Project Description - The proposed project, to be located within the boundary of the Willamette National Forest, would consist of: (1) Lake Waldo, a natural lake; (2) the existing diversion gate and connecting tunnel (both to be rehabilitated); (3) a 2.5-mile long, 30-inch diameter penstock; (4) a powerhouse to contain three Francis-type turbine-generating units with a total rated capacity of 10 MW; and (5) a transmission line to connect to an existing Bonneville Power Administration 12.5-kV line.

Proposed Scope of Studies under Permit - A preliminary permit, if issued, does not authorize construction. The Applicant seeks issuance of a 24-month preliminary permit to study the feasibility of construction and operating the proposed project. No new road construction would be required to conduct their studies.

Competing Applications - Anyone desiring to file a competing application must submit to the Commission, on or before Jan. 11, 1982, either the competing application itself (See 18 C.F.R. s4.22(a) and (d)(1980)) or a notice of intent (See 18 C.F.R. s4.22(b) and (c)(1980)) to file a competing application. Submission of a timely notice of intent allows an interested person to file an acceptable competing application no later than the time specified in s4.22(c).

Agency Comments - Federal, State, and local agencies are invited to submit comments on the described application. (A copy of the application may be obtained by agencies directly from the Applicant). If an agency does not file comments within the time set below, it will be presumed to have no comments.

Comments, Protests, or Petitions to Intervene - Anyone may submit comments, a protest, or a petition to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Rules of Practice and Procedure, 18 C.F.R. 1.08 or 1.10 (1980). In determining the appropriate action to take, the Commission will consider all protests or other comments filed, but only those who file a petition to intervene in accordance with the Commission's Rules may become a party to the proceeding. Any comments, protest, or petition to intervene must be received on or before Jan. 11, 1982.

Filing and Service of Responsive Documents - Any filings must bear in all capital letters the title "COMMENTS," "NOTICE OF INTENT TO FILE COMPETING APPLICATION," "COMPETING APPLICATION," "PROTEST," or "PETITION TO INTERVENE," as applicable, and the Project Number of this notice. Any of the above named documents must be filed by providing the original and those copies required by the Commission's regulations to Kenneth F. Plumb, Secretary, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, 825 North Capitol Street, NE, Washington, D.C. 20426. An additional copy must be sent to Fred E. Springer, Chief, Applications Branch, Division of Hydropower Licensing, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, Room 208 RB at the above address. A copy of any notice of intent, competing application, or petition to intervene must also be served upon each representative of the Applicant specified in the first paragraph of this notice.
