currently being held at WISTEC, next to Autzen Stadium. For more information about fees and schedules, call 484-9027.

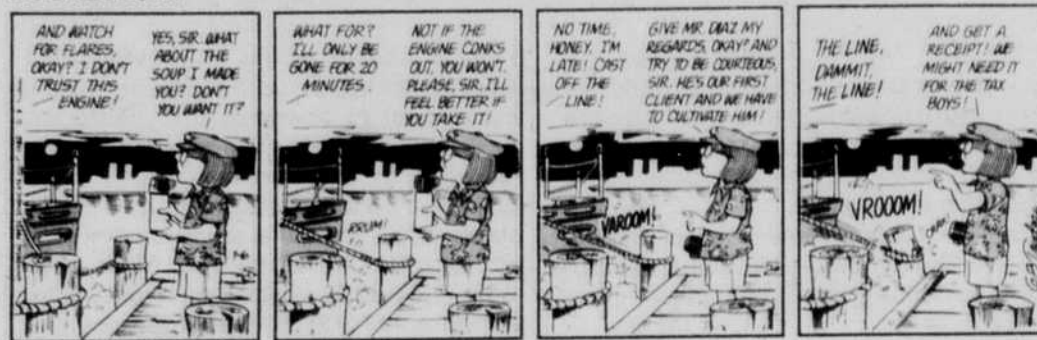
MISCELLANEOUS
