## Radio airs latest reports

**FOR UP-TO-THE-MINUTE** special session information, listen to public radio station KOAC-AM 550. The station will broadcast regular reports live.

However, the Oregon Educational Public Broadcasting System, which operates KOAC radio as well as KOAC-TV and KVDO-TV, will not be offering continuous coverage of the Legislature as it did during the regular session.

"We're up for budget cuts like

everyone else," an OEPBS staff member says.

Gov. Vic Atiyeh has proposed to chop five percent, or \$145,000, from the OEPBS budget, which receives its funding from the executive department. If the Legislature approves that cut, OEPBS probably will begin its broadcasting day at 3 p.m. instead of 8 a.m. OEPBS Executive Director Jerry Appy said this late sign-on would not take effect until this

fall because of commitments to public schools for the current school year.

The proposal is in a Ways and Means subcommittee chaired by Sen. Jim Gardner, D-Portland. Appy says Gardner will recommend that no further cuts be made in the OEPBS budget.

The OEPBS budget may be spared severe cutbacks because it already has been cut more than "practically any agency in captivity," Appy says.

"We entered the last biennium with 17 percent less of the state funds than we had before, in real dollars. That's 30 percent less if you take inflation into account," Appy says.

In addition to radio coverage, OEPBS will broadcast Atiyeh's "State of the State" address tonight at 6:30 on KOAC-TV, Channel 7.

At least one special session story will appear on "Front St. Weekly," a public affairs program aired Thursdays at 8:30 p.m., also on Channel 7.

You can let them know what your priorities are.

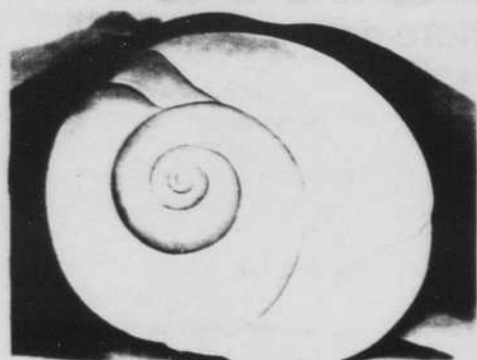
The two committees considering budget proposals are the Revenue and Ways and Means committees.
