Looking west from Prince Lucien Campbell Hall — rain drizzled to a halt; fog dissipated affording this view late Wednesday afternoon.

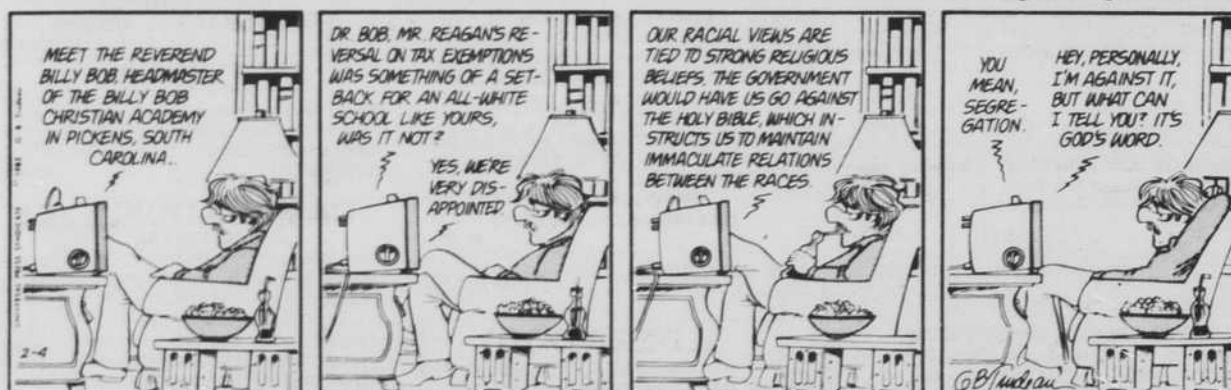
The weather should be clear and sunny through Thursday, according to the National Weather Service.
