When Alan Chow, a University senior, tried to get information on graduate schools in business administration, he was disappointed that there was very little information to be found.

Students launch center for upper-degree advice

Neither the University library nor the business school itself had much information on business graduate schools, Chow says.

When Tracy Lawrence tried to get information about law schools, she was similarly disappointed.

"What I've found is that most pre-law services apply to the University Law School, rather than law schools in general," Lawrence says.

So Lawrence and Chow decided to do something about the dearth of graduate school information by organizing the MBA and Law School information center in Room 164 of Oregon Hall.

After receiving approval from the academic advising office, Lawrence and Chow set out to build a comprehensive file of

about the schools.

Lawrence sent letters to 167 accredited law schools, which accounts for all the law schools in the United States and Canada, she says. Another aim is to provide material on pre-law education, Lawrence says.

Funding for the information center has come from Phi Eta Sigma and Alpha Lambda Delta, two freshman honorary groups that Chow and Lawrence were involved with last year. Lawrence says the center was an outgrowth of their involvement in the honoraries.

The information center will be compatible with both the business and law schools and are not intended to replace advising services they offer.

The business school does have some brochures and advises students, says Larry Ri-

information on graduate programs in law and in business administration.

The center's purpose is to give interested students information to help them find the right graduate program. Files are kept on graduate programs nationwide in both law and business administration, in addition to records of a school's mean graduate admission scores, grade point average, and other pertinent information.

Chow says he began to think about organizing an information center last summer while pondering his own graduation. During fall term, both Lawrence and Chow were busy sending letters to schools throughout the country asking for catalogs and other information. They also designed a survey form to gather specific information

chards, graduate affairs director.

"Once a student has direction, we can provide the most help because we've got the faculty," Richards says.

Lawrence says she hopes the center can become a student organization and eventually receive funding through the Incidental Fee Committee.

Also in the works are plans to find area professionals to speak to students about the law as a profession, all in an effort to make the center a place for "practical experience," Lawrence says.

Chow says that before writing to a graduate school, students should check the file at the information center.

To check out materials, a student should present a University identification card. All center materials are restricted to the academic advising office.

Office hours for the center are 10-12 a.m. and 2-4 p.m., Monday through Friday. Interested students can phone the academic advising office at 686-3211.
