National medical panel selects chemistry department head

Peter von Hippel, University chemistry department head, has been appointed to a National Institute of Health panel that helps direct basic biomedical science research in the United States.

Von Hippel, also the director of the Institute of Molecular Biology, is one of six leading medical or scientific authorities required by statute to be on the National Advisory General Medical Sciences Council. The council has 12 public members.

His appointment, effective immediately, ends Oct. 31, 1985.

The council meets three times a year to review research funding applications and recommend projects to the secretary of health and human services.

Von Hippel, 50, is one of six current University faculty who belong to the National Academy of Sciences. He is the only one who is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Von Hippel uses physical

chemistry techniques to help solve genetic puzzles. His research investigates how proteins control the expression of genes at the molecular level in viral and bacterial systems.

A member of the University faculty since 1967, he previously was employed as a physical biochemist at the Naval Medical Research Institute in Bethesda, Md., and was a biochemistry professor at the Dartmouth Medical School in Hanover, N.H.

He holds a bachelor, master's and doctoral degree from Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

English class gives teacher winning rating
