**CIA describes
Nicaragua 'buildup'**

WASHINGTON

The Reagan administration took the unusual step Tuesday of releasing photographs taken by U.S. reconnaissance aircraft depicting what it said was a massive Soviet and Cuban-backed military buildup in Nicaragua.

The buildup outlined by two top intelligence officials was portrayed as far more than Nicaragua requires for its legitimate defense needs and as posing a threat to neighboring

countries.

One of the officials, Deputy CIA Director Adm. Bobby Inman, said the disclosures were the first in a series aimed at providing the evidence on which the administration is basing its policies in Central America.

Details about Cuban-Nicaraguan cooperation in funneling arms to rebels in El Salvador will be released later in the week, Inman suggested.

Inman and John Hughes, deputy director of the defense intelligence agency, alleged that:

- Since the leftist government took power in 1979, 36 new military garrisons have been established in Nicaragua, all

modeled along Soviet and Cuban lines.

- The Soviets have provided to Nicaragua 25 T-55 tanks, 12 152mm howitzers, two Hip helicopters and 12 armored personnel carriers. Deliveries of additional T-55's are expected in the coming months.

- Construction is well under way to lengthen several airstrips at military bases, apparently for the purpose of accommodating MiG-17 or MiG-21 aircraft. Some 50 Nicaraguan pilots are being trained in Bulgaria.

- Nicaraguan regular military forces are being increased to at least 25,000 or 30,000 men, and the militia to a minimum of 150,000.

- Some 2,000 Cuban military advisers have been sent to Nicaragua along with 50 to 70 Soviet military personnel.

**Candidates claim
election fraud**

GUATEMALA CITY

Opposition candidates called for a demonstration Tuesday to protest what they called widespread fraud in Guatemala's presidential election, but the military-dominated government warned the demonstration would be "repressed."

The three civilian candidates, who trailed in Sunday's election, scheduled the rally for 5 p.m. — 6 p.m. EST — in front of the National Palace.

It was not clear if they still planned the demonstration following the government announcement.

Presidential spokesman Carlos Toledo Vielman, speaking at a news conference with Defense Minister Gen. Rene Mendoza and the army chief of staff, reminded protest organizers of a law that requires a permit three days before a demonstration.

Opposition parties withdrew their representatives from the vote counting on Tuesday, claiming there was widespread fraud and manipulation in the vote count.

Gen. Angel Anibal Guevara, candidate of a coalition that includes a party that has shared power for 12 years, held a lead that gave him 37 percent of the votes counted. He apparently will not get more than 50 percent, which will force Congress to choose the president from the top two candidates.

Leftists boycotted the election, claiming their candidates would be killed by right-wing death squads.
