

# Campus Republicans, Democrats unite

Raging administration officials were cautious in their reaction to the recent merger of the University Democrats and College Republicans.

Secretary Upstate Alexander Keg said "this inexorable conspiratorial *modus operandi* should not be perceived as exacerbating the enunciation of domestic homogeneity."

When Pres. Ronald Raging was asked to comment on the situation, he said only "I have no prepared remarks, however" before he was hustled away by a band of aides.

University Democrats President Quiche Frohnmayer and College Republican Chairman Goliath Wryandour announced the merger at a press conference Monday, proclaiming "a new spirit of compromise and an end to partisanship."

"We got tired of being the token liber-

als on campus," Frohnmayer said cheerfully. "We wanted our work to result in something other than more talk. Besides, if you can't beat 'em, join 'em."

Wryandour, said the College Republicans agreed to the merger in order to revitalize their tired ideas. "The Republican Party has been focusing on issues that have been around for years, like the economy and foreign policy. We want to use a more eclectic approach to the political reality in the United States. We want to examine issues like windfall profits for ticket scalpers."

Wryandour has sent a letter explaining the merger to President Raging and College Republican mentor Rarely Falls-well. He said there have been threats to cut off funding for the group, and that the group may be in for some tough times.

"We may be in for some tough times," he said.

in the job, and was buying a new tie for the upcoming interview with the bored in Portland.

Ed Hurts, bored president, said he was delighted to have found such qualified candidates at such reasonable prices.

Bauche, 80, served in the Army Eire Corps for 27 years before being discharged for mispronouncing "Faith an' begorah to ya' your worshipfulness."

"We need to shore up the structure of tired education to lay a foundation for

youth in this state, and tear down old programs while putting a floor on budget cuts and a ceiling on faculty pay increases," he said.

Ontherange is best known for his role in constructing the coalition that led to the building of Animal House, the rehabilitation center for household pets suffering from drug abuse.

He does not wear ties.

The Lord Chancellor is responsible for overseeing activities at all eight colleges and universities in the Stateless System of Tired Education. He receives a salary of \$75,000, use of a luxurious three-room

residence close to the railroad tracks and a state moped. Only the governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, speaker of the house, senate president, state department heads and 357 janitors and stockroom clerks in the Executive Department receive higher salaries.

The chancellor's job is often used as a political diving board. Former chancellors include such political falling stars as Slain County Commissioners Jerry "Marijuana" Bust and archie-rivals Reggie Weinstein, and perennial presidential hopeful Harold Stassens.
