## Timbers come to Autzen

Smoothing out the rough edges will be coach Vic Crowe's aim when the Portland Timbers bring their North American Soccer League act to Autzen Stadium Sunday for a preseason clash with the Edmonton Drillers.

Crowe has not yet said who will be in the Portland lineup for the 4 p.m. kickoff, but he did say that he will be taking a close look at how his squad blends together as they close out the preseason and gear up for the regular-season opener next Friday at Seattle.

In their only other outing of the preseason, the Timbers defeated Edmonton 1-0 on midfielder Brian Gant's 25-yard blast last Sunday in Victoria, British Columbia.

Crow used that first contest to get a look at his personnel, playing all 17 players that were activated for the game. Injured defender Bernie Fagan was the only Timber who didn't see action. Fagan will be sidelined again this week.

Last Sunday Crowe went with a 4-3-3 lineup

with a starting lineup which had second-year Timber Dragan Radovich in goal, Willie Donachie, Gary Collier, Young Jeung Cho and Glenn Myernick in defense, John Pratt, John Bain and Gant in midfield, and Willie Anderson, Ron Futcher and Dale Mitchell up front.

Futcher, who was the all-time leading scorer at Minnesota when the franchise folded after last season, is one of several new faces on the Timber squad this spring. Other newcomers include goalkeeper Bill Irwin who is likely to see action Sunday, midfielder rookie Greg Ion who is back from a serious knee injury suffered in a reserve game last summer, and midfielder Carl Strong who came to the Timbers from Atlanta.

The Timbers will be sponsoring a coaches clinic Saturday night at Harris Hall in the Lane County Courthouse at 7:30 p.m. Timbers Gant, Chris Hellenkamp and Ion will be on hand.

Last spring at Autzen the Timbers defeated San Diego, the team they eventually fell to in the playoffs.

**Oregon's women's softball team** will swing into action Friday when they begin play at the Southern Oregon tournament in Ashland.

The Ducks enter the 1982 campaign under first year coach Charles Sylvester hoping to improve their attack and their 9-19 record from 1981.

The Ducks will compete in a round-robin group which includes Western Oregon, Oregon Tech, and Central Oregon. First place teams from each of the two groups will meet Saturday afternoon for the tournament title.

Sylvester said this tournament will give him a better idea of where his team is headed as it readies for the home opener next Friday, a 2:30 p.m. double-header with Portland State.

**The Oregon club sports rugby squad** travels to Ferndale, Washington Saturday to meet Western Washington for the Pacific Northwest Rugby Union championship.

Oregon won the state title by virtue of its 6-0 win over Oregon State. It was the first time in 10 years that an Oregon squad defeated OSU.

Saturday's winner will advance to the western regionals in Santa Barbara, slated for next weekend.

**Oregon men's track coach Bill Dellinger** has been named assistant coach for the U.S. Olympic team for the 1984 Los Angeles Summer games. Dellinger represented the U.S. in the 1956, 1960 and 1964 games as a distance runner.

**Tom Helinonen, women's head track coach**, has been selected as an assistant coach for the West squad in this summer's National Sports Festival.

**Oregon women's gymnastics coach Gary Vanderhoff** has resigned from his post for what he calls family reasons. Vanderhoff is reportedly moving to California.

**The Oregon men's tennis team** suffered a 6-3 setback at the hands of Lewis and Clark State College of Idaho Thursday. The loss dropped the Ducks' record to 5-3 on the season.

Oregon had raised its record to 5-2 on Wednesday with a 6-3 victory over the University of Portland as Stewart Bartlett won his no. 1 singles match 7-6, 6-2, and then teamed with Ron Elvin for a 6-4, 6-6, 6-2 win in no. 1 doubles action. "I'm very pleased," said coach Buzz Summers of his team's effort. "They're a good group of players and they have a lot of enthusiasm."

Oregon's next match is against Southern Oregon on Saturday. Meanwhile, the Oregon women's tennis team will be idle until April 13 after this weekend's Southern Oregon invitational in Ashland was cancelled. The women take on Oregon State in Corvallis on April 13.

Oregon is 1-5 on the season following a tough road trip through California, but coach Nancy Osborne remains optimistic. "We've been working really hard," she says. "This year we want to finish second in the region." Oregon was third last year.

**LOS ANGELES (AP) — Pete Rozelle**, National Football League commissioner, testified Thursday that the move of the Los Angeles Rams from the Coliseum to the stadium in suburban Anaheim benefited all pro football followers in the area.

"Anaheim Stadium sold out and so television of home games was sent to 2½ million fans in Southern California," he said on the witness stand.

Rozelle was one of the first witnesses in the retrial of the antitrust case brought by the Oakland Raiders and the Coliseum against the National Football League.

The Rams vacated the Coliseum in 1980 and the Raiders tried to move in, but the NFL owners said no.

The first trial ended in a deadlock in August when jurors voted 8-2 in favor of the Raiders.

At issue is NFL constitution Rule 4.3 which requires a 75 percent vote of the 28 member teams before a club can move.

The owners, with nearly all of them voting, were unanimous in their opposition to the Raiders' move so the club sued the league.

Coliseum lawyer Maxwell Blecher reminded Rozelle on Thursday that he earlier said the Rams got the most out of the move. But Rozelle replied that "when I reflected, I decided the significant fact was to the public."

"I asked Rosenbloom (late Rams owner Carroll Rosenbloom) to reflect again before making the move, I thought it was to his best interest to stay in the Coliseum," Rozelle said. Rozelle was general manager of the Rams before becoming commissioner in 1960.

## Men linksters tied for 10th in first round

**FRESNO, Calif.** — The Oregon men's golf team shot a first-round 378 Thursday afternoon to tie for tenth place at the Fresno State-Pepsi Golf Classic.

First-day leader USC is 15 strokes up on the Ducks at 363, but only one stroke ahead of second place Stanford.

Eric Johnson leads Oregon with a first round score of 72, three shots off the pace set by Jeff Johnson of UCLA at 69. Four players are tied at 70.

The weather was cool and windy as the Ducks waited through a two-hour delay in their starting time Thursday morning, and Oregon golf coach Jim Ferguson said the Ducks generally did not play well but were still within striking distance.

"I hope we play better tomorrow — we aren't that far out from the first three or four teams," Ferguson said.

The 18-team tournament resumes Friday and will conclude Saturday afternoon.
