"She ran the fastest time by a collegian this year, a school record and a lifetime best by two minutes. She ran it all by herself, which is pretty remarkable."

And this weekend, against Arizona, Hayes set another school record in her first-ever 5,000-meter race, clipping Eryn Forbes' old mark by almost 23 seconds with a time of 15:44.76.

So, with two school records under her belt, Hayes seems destined to be one of the best women to race for the Ducks.

Hayes spent the fall incorporating the same fluid, economical running style she uses on the track for the women's cross country team throughout the entire season. She was one of Oregon's top three runners and 16th in the NCAA cross country championships, earning the Oregon freshman all-American honors.

"I felt I had ran my best race ever (at the championships), and it was a nice way to end the season," Hayes says. The Duck women finished second overall, and Hayes played a major role in the Ducks' success.

"She was head and shoulders above where we hoped she would be in cross country, too," Heinonen says. Add to that the fact she is head and shoulders above much of the University student body with a 4.0 grade point average, and one gets an idea of the character of the person behind the runner.

Heinonen has only praise for his star freshman. "She has run so fast already, it makes a coach wonder what she can do three years down the road."

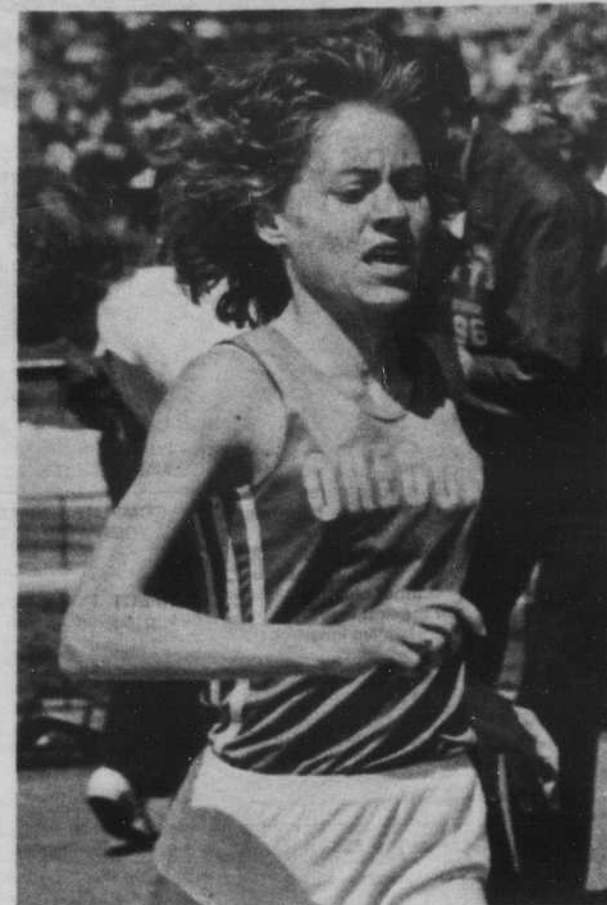

The Oregon men's tennis team took an easy 8-1 win over Western Oregon State College Wednesday to run its season record to 10-8.

Easy wins were the rule rather than the exception against the Wolves. Stewart Bartlett took a 6-1, 6-3 win in No. 1 singles. Don Hallock was a 6-0, 6-2 winner at No. 2. Todd DeNeff won 6-2, 6-2 at No. 5 and Jeff Gross was a 6-1, 6-1 victor at No. 6.

It was the second straight victory for the Ducks following an 8-1 win over Lewis and Clark College in Portland Monday. Bartlett led the way for Oregon in that one, taking his No. 1 singles match by a 7-5, 6-2 count and teaming with Ron Elvin for a 6-3, 6-1 win in No. 1 doubles.

The Ducks will now head for Washington for a match tonight at 7 against the Lakewood Racquet Club of Tacoma, and continue on the rest of the weekend with matches against the University of Washington, the Bellevue Athletic Club, the Issaquah Tennis Club and the Supersonics Tennis Club.

Meanwhile, the Oregon women's tennis team has been on a tear of late. The Ducks trounced Oregon State 9-0 on Tuesday, giving them a sweep over the Beavers for the season. Oregon defeated OSU 7-2 in Corvallis.

Prior to the Oregon State match, the Ducks had routed Puget Sound 9-0 on April 22 and split with the Washington schools in the Washington Invitational in Seattle on April 23-25. Oregon defeated Washington State 7-2 in a match coach Nancy Osborne said could have gone either way.

The Ducks then lost to a powerful Washington team 7-2. It was the first time in a couple of years that the Huskies had lost two matches to a Northwest opponent. Lindsay Bartlett and the doubles team of Cathy Rudolph-Joanne Chamberlain were the winners of those two matches, Bartlett defeating UW's Christie Dorsey 6-4, 6-4 in No. 1 singles and Rudolph-Chamberlain taking a 7-6, 6-4 victory in the No. 3 doubles slot.

Oregon, now 3-1 in Region 9 Conference play, will face Idaho in a home match on Saturday, and then it's the regional championships May 6-9 in Eugene.

The Oregon Cycling Club will hold its annual U of O Criterium on the campus Sunday. The race, which starts at the covered tennis courts on

15th Ave., turns down University St. to 13th Ave., runs down to Agate St. before turning back onto 15th for the enclosed loop.

A novice event is scheduled for noon, with a United State Cycling Federation Category 1 and II race set for 1 p.m. The expert race will be run as a memorial to former club member Richard McBirney.

A \$2.50 entry fee is required. \$150 to \$175 in prize money will be awarded.

80 riders competed last year from USCF teams in the Northwest.

Dave Krauss of the Oregon table tennis team walked away with a first and three seconds at last weekend's Paddle Palace Open in Portland.

Krauss teamed with Selim Hassan for first in the 2800 Doubles, while gaining runnerup honors in the 1500, 1700 and 1900 singles. Dave Corbett of Oregon won the 1300 singles division.

The teams' trophies will be on display at the EMU Recreation Center in the basement. Oregon closes out its season against Oregon State in two weeks.
