The Oregon men's tennis team took a 7-2 win over Portland State University Tuesday. Coupled with four wins in five matches in the state of Washington, the victory upped the Ducks' season record to 15-9.

The match against the Vikings was simply a mismatch. Both of the Ducks' losses came as a result of defaults, as both Ron Elvin and Don Hallock sat out the match with injuries. Thus Oregon entered no players at No. 6 singles or No. 3 doubles.

Otherwise, it was a series of easy wins for Oregon. The singles wins were highlighted by a 6-3, 6-3 victory for Bob Coron at No. 3 singles and 6-4, 6-1 wins for Todd DeNeff and Jeff Gross at Nos. 4 and 5.

In doubles action, DeNeff and Stewart Bartlett fought back from a one-set deficit to take a 2-6, 6-1, 6-2 win and the team of Coron and Wade Judy won a three-set decision, 6-4, 4-6, 6-0.

Oregon closes spring football drills against a team comprised of former Duck players, and no one will be happier to see the Alumni in uniform Saturday afternoon at Autzen Stadium than head coach Rich Brooks.

Kickoff is scheduled for 1 p.m. and is the first event of the day that concludes with the Big Green Benefit dinner and auction at the Lane County Fairgrounds that night.

"The alumni will give us a pretty good test," Brooks forecasts. "We've been playing against our own people all spring and it will be good to face someone other than ourselves."

"I'll be interested in seeing if we can move the ball and score against the Alumni since that was our problem last season."

Brooks said a strong group of ex-Ducks should be assembled for the game, which will include all aspects of a regular game including kickoffs and punt returns.

"Vince Goldsmith, the rookie of the year in the Canadian Football League for the Saskatchewan Roughriders, may play," Brooks said. "I understand Reggie Ogburn is going to play, too."

San Diego Charger quarterback Dan Fouts, who made a cameo appearance in the Alumni game two years ago, will be in attendance at the Big Green Benefit, and former San Francisco 49er linebacker Dave Wilcox will be on the sidelines for the game.

Those players expressing an interest in playing for the Alumni team are Bruce Beekeley, who played for Green Bay and Atlanta in the NFL; defensive end Terry Dion, formerly of the Seattle Seahawks; defensive end Neil Elshire of Minnesota and former CFL players Chuck Willis and Jack Rust.

The present-day Ducks are practicing Thursday during the final week of drills before the squaring off with the Alumni.

"We plan on working on getting better technique from our players and evaluating personnel during this last week," Brooks said. "The Alumni game will test our players to see how they adjust to game like situations."

Brooks said only center Ron Teed, who is suffering from a neck injury, is the only player definitely out of the Alumni game.

Running backs Ladarja Johnson and Alex Mack, who missed last Friday's scrimmage, were expected back to drills this week to bolster that corps, but the extent of Harry Billups' knee injury and his availability is up in the air.
