 • Friday's Canoe Fete. Floats concurring with an "On Broadway" theme will be at the Mill Race beginning at 4:30 p.m. for a 6 p.m. competition. Awards will be given in several categories by the Student University Relations Council. Sororities and fraternities will also be teamed up for this event.
