Emerald chooses editors; Healy, Green get top jobs

The Oregon Daily Emerald has selected its editorial staff for the 1982-83 school year.

Editor Harry Esteve, this year's news editor, chose John Healy for the managing editor position. Healy, a senior majoring in journalism and political science, currently is assistant news editor and was the Emerald's sports editor for the 1979-80 school year. Healy also served as a sports writer for the Springfield News.

Journalism senior Marian Green was selected as news editor. Green currently is community editor and was departments and schools editor during the 1980-81 school year. She served an internship as a reporter on the Valley Times newspaper in Pleasanton, Calif. last summer and will serve as an intern on the Spokesman-Review newspaper in Spokane,

Wash., this summer.

The editor, managing editor and news editor picked the balance of the 15-member news staff after interviewing approximately 30 applicants.

Cort Fernald, a second year graduate student in journalism and the Emerald's current editorial page editor, was chosen assistant news editor. Fernald was editor of the Siskiyou, the Southern Oregon State College newspaper, for the 1980-81 school year.

Joan Nyland, who will graduate from the Honors College in history this year, was selected as editorial page editor. Nyland is a past editor of the student newspaper at St. Mary's Academy in Portland.

Bob Baker, a photo journalism senior, was rehired for his present position of photo editor.

The 1982-83 Emerald entertainment editor is Jonathon Siegle, a journalism graduate student. Siegle is a contributing editor for the Oregon Democrat and a former high school instructor in journalism and English.

Mike Riplinger, a journalism senior, was chosen 1982-83 sports editor. He will intern this summer as a sports writer on the Lewiston (Idaho) Tribune.

Paul Danzer, a senior journalism major, was picked for the assistant sports editor position. Danzer contributed frequently to the Emerald's sports pages and served as interim sports

editor last summer at the Gresham Outlook.

Debbie Howlett, a journalism senior and 1981-82 departments and schools editor, was chosen as associate editor for higher education. Howlett was news editor during the 1980-81 school year on the Siskiyou, the student newspaper for SOSOC and was a sports stringer for the Ashland Daily Tidings.

David Brown, who will transfer from Lane Community College to the University as a junior in journalism, will be the Emerald's 1982-83 community editor. Brown is literary editor of LCC's Denali Magazine.

Kirk Knighton was chosen politics editor for the 1982-83 school year. Knighton, a senior in political science and English, is a free lance writer and past copy editor for the Emerald.

Sandy Johnstone, a junior journalism major, is the Emerald's new departments and schools editor. Johnstone is the current features editor on the paper and has worked as a full-time intern on the Daily Journal of Commerce and as part-time reporter on the Gresham Outlook.

Richard Burr, a sophomore journalism major, will serve as an associate editor for ASUO. Burr contributed articles frequently to the Emerald this year and was a writer for the Arizona State Press, the college newspaper for Arizona State University, during the 1980-81 school year.
