"Steep Terrain Rescue" is the topic of a workshop Friday and Saturday at the Black Angus Restaurant, 2133 Franklin Blvd. Sponsored by the University's Continuing Education department, the workshop will include an indoor session on Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. featuring steep terrain first aid and management.
