

Board loans IFC money

IFC-funded groups seeking a loan will now deal with the new ASUO/IFC Credit Committee.

The committee, formed in July, takes the place of the "horrible" payback accounts system, according to ASUO Comptroller Alan Contreras.

Under the payback system, the loans had to be budgeted in advance. This amounted to \$13,000 in extra fees collected from students last year, Contreras says.

Since the money was already budgeted, "there wasn't a whole lot of incentive" for the

ASUO to collect the loans from clubs that didn't repay, he says.

The new credit committee "takes care" of these problems, Contreras says.

The money doled out in loans by the committee won't ultimately come from student fees because clubs that get loans must pay them back, he says.

"If they don't, we freeze the rest of their budget," Contreras adds. In essence, the committee "authorizes a temporary deficit," he says.

Charges against athletes dropped

Coercion charges against one current and two former University football players have been dropped after the Oregon Supreme Court overturned the state's coercion law Tuesday.

University tailback Dwight Robertson and former players Reggie Young and Andrew Paige faced charges of coercion and sodomy involving sex-

ual activities with a woman in November 1978.

Oregon's coercion law is too broad and violates the right of free speech, according to the court's ruling.

The ruling does not affect the sodomy charges, but an attorney for the football players said the sodomy charges should be dropped because without the coercion charges, "forcible compulsion" could not be proved and it is necessary for a conviction on sodomy charges.
