

South is just one of the many schools in the area with track facilities open to the public. To find one in your area, the *Emerald* suggests a nice slog around the neighborhood.

The following paths are short-order diversions maintained by the City of Eugene Parks and Recreation Department (as is Alton Baker Park.) They are named for their locations:

Amazon Parkway

The jogging path is one mile long with a shorter, 1500 meter cut-off loop. An exercise station is located at the north end of the loop, near 24th Street and Amazon Parkway.

Hawkins Heights

A quarter-mile path is located in this otherwise undeveloped park in southwest Eugene. The park can be reached from Trillium or Hawkins Heights Streets.

Sorrel Way

One-third mile long, this path is located in a small neighborhood park east of Coburg Road. The park is accessible from Sorrel Way or Rustic Place.

Westmoreland

A round trip on this path totals three-quarters of a mile. The path begins just west of the tennis courts at 20th Avenue and Polk Street.

THE STREETS

While technically illegal to

romp directly on the city streets, the sidewalks are usually conducive to some good "road" work.

For the macho jogger, the streets can represent a better choice than "sissy sawdust paths."

One nice thing about Eugene is the preponderance of Bicyclists, especially in the Univer-

sity area, which helps to eliminate a little of the "automotive air."
