Living in the dorms and tired of the same old thing for lunch? Have an apartment and too tired to fix your own Top Ramen? Feeling run down? Hungry? Relax.

There are scads of restaurants in the campus area within easy walking distance for either lunch or dinner.

THE EMU FISHBOWL

Let's start with the shop closest to campus. The Fishbowl serves a variety of sandwiches in a cafeteria style. You tell them what you want, and they make it. If you want a coke, you pour it yourself. Bagels, cream cheese and fruit are also available.

THE FACULTY CLUB

Corner of 13th Avenue and University Street

Soups and salads and sandwiches, with the spice of actually eating in an atmosphere called "The Faculty Club." They serve to both faculty and students, and the location is right.

THE GIANT GRINDER

764 E. 13th Ave.

The newest sandwich shop on 13th Avenue, the Giant Grinder offers sandwiches and salads. For three dollars you get a plate and access to an all-you-can-eat salad bar. The sandwiches are priced from \$1.50 to \$4.50 for a complete grinder sandwich. All the sandwiches are served on a French

grinder roll. There is another Giant Grinder located on 18th Avenue by the Big Dipper.

SUBWAY SANDWICHES

1304 Hilyard St.

Another sandwich shop. You have your choice of any number of submarine sandwiches in an assortment of different sizes, including six-inch snack and double meat snack subs.

KONA CAFE

853 E. 13th Ave.

Sandwiches with a Hawaiian twist. Burgers, fruit and cheese, wine, juices, all for about \$3 a meal. The Kona Cafe's breakfasts include omelettes, eggs, and an a la carte section.

LENNIE'S NOSH BAR

659 E. 13th Ave.

Don't worry about what a Nosh bar is. Lennie serves good sandwiches and excellent cheesecake, bagels with cream cheese and lox, salad and other assorted goodies. Lennie's is located in the Courtyard, which you'll soon locate if you read the Emerald classified personals. Get set for another year of Luigi and his friends.

PIZAN'S

1225 Alder St.

Still another sandwich shop. Pizan's is a genuine delicatessen, complete with salami's hanging in the window. They serve basic sandwiches by the number.

WILLIAMS FOOD

1249 Alder St.

Sandwiches and burgers for

lunch; eggs, bacon and pancakes for breakfast. If you're an early bird you can catch their breakfast special from 7-9 a.m. weekday mornings. Williams makes all their own bread, chili, muffins, pies and rolls.

SY'S PIZZA SLICES

1211 Alder St.

New York style pizza with the option of ordering a slice or a whole pizza. You have a choice of Sicilian or neopolitan pizzas. A slice of either is \$1.05, with 45 cents for each topping. The toppings range from the normal mushroom or sausage to pineapple. The pizza is different daily — it all depends on who is cooking. Sy delivers.

JEB'S

1350 Alder St.

Hotdogs with a twist. If you like a plain hot dog, you've got it. You also have a choice of a mexi-pup, a mexican hot dog, or a chili dog. Jeb says he's got the best dogs in town and he could be right. He also serves burgers with the same type of variety. Jeb serves some of the best fries in town. You eat the food outside, though, so bring a coat.

HOMEFRIED TRUCKSTOP

790 E. 14th Ave.

The Truckstop caters more to the organic crowd, but the food and prices are good enough for everyone. Breakfasts are the usual eggs and pancakes, with some specialties like tofu scramble, a breakfast enchilada.

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
