

# Israelis on troop bus ambushed; 6 killed

**BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP)** — Six Israeli soldiers were killed Sunday and 22 others wounded, half of them seriously, when ambushers fired automatic weapons and bazookas at a troop bus east of the war-torn Lebanese capital, the Israeli military command said.

The Israeli military command said its troops were "combing the area" near the eastern mountain village of Aley for the gunmen who attacked the bus. Its statement released from Tel Aviv did not say who was suspected of carrying out the

attack.

The rightist Christian Voice of Lebanon radio station said the Israeli soldiers were killed or wounded in the attack near Aley, a Moslem-populated town on the Beirut-Damascus highway about 10 miles southeast of the capital.

A spokesman for the Israeli press office near Beirut, who would identify himself only as Lt. Stuart, said the troops were riding in a civilian bus and were attacked in the afternoon.

Voice of Lebanon said Israeli

helicopters evacuated wounded soldiers and a curfew was imposed in the village, about six miles in front of the Syrian lines.

It was not clear who was responsible for the attack. The Palestine Liberation Organization is believed to have about 10,000 fighters among the estimated 25,000 Syrian troops in northern and eastern Lebanon.

Meanwhile, in Beirut, a land mine exploded in the downtown area, wounding at least six people. The rest of the city

was quiet Sunday.

The Lebanese army set up checkpoints on nearly every street corner in east and west Beirut with the aid of the 3,500 U.S., French and Italian peacekeepers who returned to the capital following the Sept. 16-18 massacre at two Palestinian refugee camps.

Also in Beirut, Lebanese newspapers reported that Pres. Amin Gemayel wants to form an interim Cabinet, headed by Lebanon's security chief and including other military men.

## Pulitzer trial; 'snow', seamy sex, seances

**WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP)** — Millionaire publishing heir Peter Pulitzer, fighting for custody of his young twins in a seamy divorce trial, says he confronted one of his wife's alleged lovers last year and demanded: "What do you feel toward my wife?"

"I'm infatuated with her," Brian Richards responded, according to Pulitzer's deposition, made available Thursday.

Pulitzer, 52, a tanned, white-haired sportsman and international hotelier,

was expected to testify late today or Monday in a trial that has bared the details of a 6½-year marriage in the fast lane, including unusual sex, cocaine use and late-night seances.

Pulitzer is battling his wife, Roxanne, for custody of their 5-year-old twin sons, Zachary and MacLean. She also wants half of Pulitzer's fortune, estimated at \$2.5 million by him and \$25 million by his wife.

Mrs. Pulitzer, 31, has temporary custody and lives in the couple's lakeview

ranch house in Palm Beach, driving to court each day in her \$20,000 black Porsche.

Pulitzer, grandson of Joseph Pulitzer, for whom the Pulitzer prizes in journalism, music and literature are named, lives on his 73-foot yacht, the Seahunter.

Richards has been subpoenaed to testify but has not appeared in court.

Mrs. Godbout, who Mrs. Pulitzer fired, also testified that Grand Prix race car driver Jackie Ickx and Mrs. Pulitzer hugged and kissed each other while

lying on the beach one day as the twins were watching. "It made the boys uncomfortable," she testified.

Mrs. Godbout said she also saw Mrs. Pulitzer in bed with Ickx.

Under questioning by his wife's attorney, Pulitzer testified in the deposition that he had participated in three-way sex with his wife and Jacqueline Kimberly.

Mrs. Kimberly, 32, is married to 76-year-old James Kimberly, of the Kimberly-Clark Kleenex tissue fortune.
