SUAB will readjust

The ASUO constitutional committee decided Tuesday that the Student University Affairs Board should reapportion.

The committee will let SUAB decide on its own "reasonable" reapportionment plan for the 18 board positions. Board members are elected by "academic constituencies" — traditionally interpreted as school majors — and the ASUO Constitution empowers the

committee to review and rearrange the constituencies "to insure reasonably equal representation."

Alan Contreras, ASUO comptroller — acting as a "concerned student" — said year-old enrollment figures show some schools do not deserve board positions and SUAB's election process guarantees "double representation" for the chair's constituency.

reached in an emergency.

"Sometimes there will be an emergency, and we will need to reach a student, but we can't get ahead of him."

Different offices at the University are making it easier to update an address.

Change of address forms are available during registration at the tuition tables and every day at the registrar's office. The

form is easy to fill out, and once it is completed it is punched into a computer and filed.

Bowlin judges the transition period between spring and fall terms is a major contributor to incorrect addresses.

"Students will move out of the dorms, or from one apartment to another, and we just don't get their current address," he says.

Abortion: A woman's choice

Abortion is safe and legal in a clinic setting. The Portland Women's Health Center offers abortion services up to 18 weeks from the last menstrual period. The abortion procedure used up to 12 weeks is vacuum aspiration with minimal dilation.

Dilation and Evacuation (an adaptation of the suction method) is used for abortions 13 to 18 weeks. Abortions are performed with optional local anesthetic.
