What started as a sprinkling of leotards and ballet slippers has become a torrent of shimmering, shiny, striped leotards, canvas-and-leather jazz oxfords, bright leg warmers, tights in every texture and color and free-swinging mini cover-ups.

The trend began with an anything-goes, New Wave approach. Now it's not unusual to see women on the streets and on campus dressed in various dancewear, with no intention of dancing.

Quite a few dance supply store customers are non-dancers, according to store proprietors. "It's gotten to the point where it's a craze," says Karen Asbury, manager of Backstage Dancewear.

"Regular department stores are making copies of dance shoes and leg warmers that are not really designed for dancing," Asbury adds.

Choosy customers may



prefer shopping at dance boutiques where they find better quality and a bigger selection of dancewear, although at slightly higher prices.

Backstage Dancewear, located at 943 Olive St., has a large selection of leg warmers and about 30 different colors of tights to choose from.

Albert's Hosiery, at 266 Valley River Center, is another major dance supply store in Eugene. It stocks a large supply of leg warmers and 15 different colors of tights. Albert's carries Danskin, Gilda and its own name brand.

Michelle Powers, a masters dance student, covers up a cotton-Lycra striped leotard with a low-sashed black and beige jersey culotte minidress. She adds sparkly leg warmers and flexible Capezio jazz oxfords, which she tells us are as popular now with men as with women.

Michelle is one of the hottest dancers in town. She belongs to the New Jazz Theater and has recently formed her own dance company, Powers & Jeans.
