But you'll have to watch out for the weather. This is Oregon

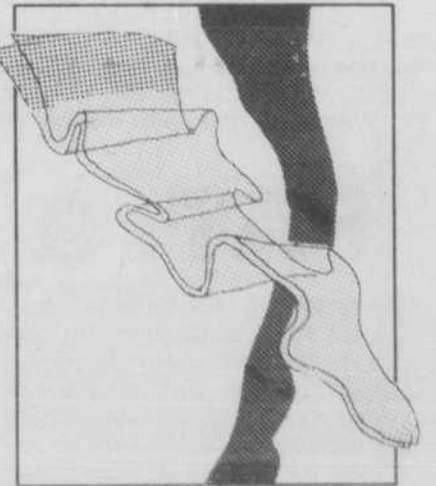


and wet days are here. A good answer to wet feet are duck shoes or "jelly beans," now in day-glo rubber with contrasting leather uppers.
