

Deadline for IFC funding approaching

Goal statements for groups wanting incidental fee funds are due Nov. 1, says David Gibson, ASUO vice president of administration and finance.

New groups needing help in the goals process should contact the Incidental Fee Committee or Gibson.

New organizations need to be registered with Katcha Phinney, ASUO director of University

events, before they are allowed into the goals process, Gibson says.

Goal requirement forms are available in EMU Suite 4.

The ASUO is willing to help any group through the process, Gibson says. Copies of past program goals are available as examples, he adds.

Programs should submit their goals on time "to avoid un-

necessary worry," Gibson says.

"We can be lenient with new groups to a point — within one week (of the due date)," he says. "If established programs are late we will consider that a reflection of the program's management."

The IFC will hold goals hear-

ings for all new groups, Gibson says, although approval of a group's goals does not mean the program will automatically receive funding, Gibson says.

"There is no inherent right to be funded," he says.

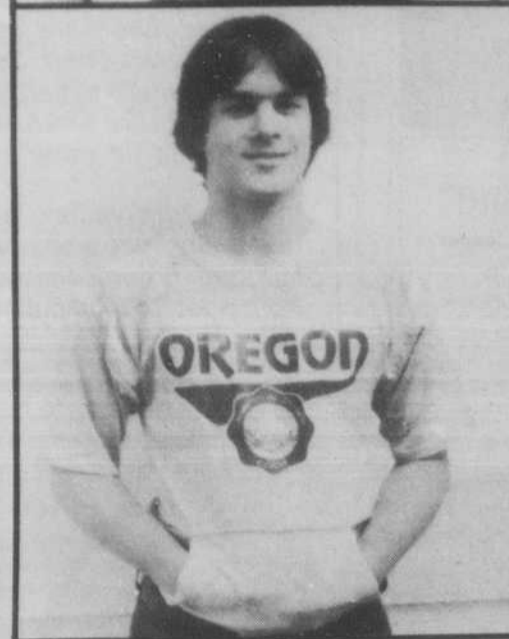
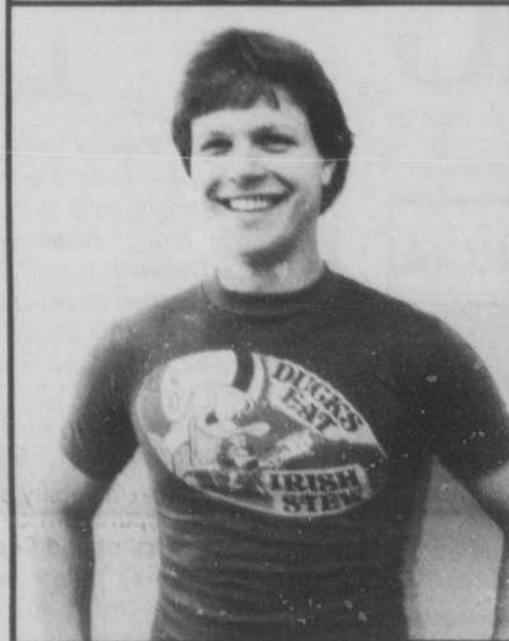
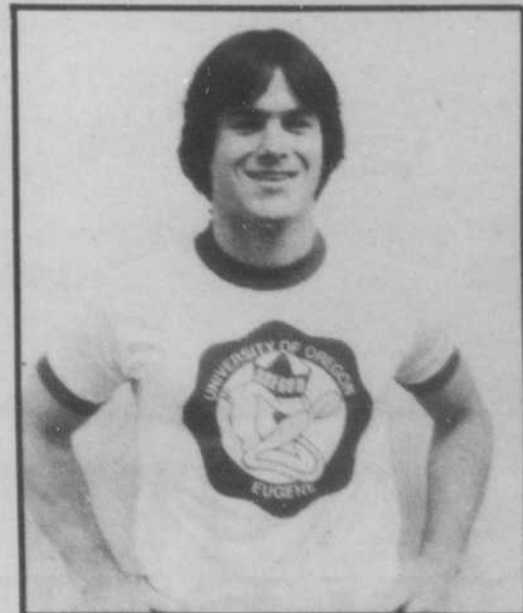
