

"If we had passed her plan we would be back in special session right now trying to raise more money," Wingard says.

Hendriksen has prided herself on her voting record in the areas of environmental protection, the maintenance and growth of education, health and social programs and the rights of

senior citizens. Hendriksen boasts a 100 percent voting record from such diverse groups as the Oregon AFL-CIO, Oregon Women's Political Caucus, and the Oregon Environmental Council, United Seniors of Oregon and the Association of Oregon Faculties.

Wingard also boasts endorsements by the Oregon Environmental Council and the Oregon AFL-CIO along with a 95 percent rating from the Lane County Democratic Central Committee. Wingard is proud of his environmental stands and says the most significant environmental issue addressed in the

last session of the legislature was the Senate bill to clean up Wah Chang's low level nuclear waste dump in the Willamette River flood plain.

"I don't want Oregon to be a dumpsite for low level nuclear waste," Wingard says. Hendriksen is also opposed to dumping at the site.

Novice Cross goes against incumbent Ed Fadeley

University student and political novice Mike Cross is challenging incumbent Democrat Edward Fadeley for the Senate District 21 seat in the Nov. 2 election.

Cross, who's only prior governmental experience is with the Willamalane Comprehensive Review Committee and his precinct, is tackling the Goliath of the Senate's Democratic faction. Fadeley has been in the Senate for 18 years and is currently the co-chairman of the Joint Ways and Means Committee, the body controlling all state appropriations.

Cross will need more than a sling and a rock to fell this political giant.

Fadeley is a faithful supporter of higher education's concerns. He points to 1977 when he chaired the Senate Subcommittee on Education Finance as a time when tuition was at its lowest ratio to the actual cost of instruction.

Fadeley was running unopposed last May when Cross, with a last minute write-in effort,

landed the Republican nomination Senate District 21.

Fadeley says he is not "cavalier" about his opponent's try for the seat. But he says if people can remember Fadeley's accomplishments "they will vote for me because of the skill level, even though I am fat and fifty."

Four years ago he fought off the Governor and Portland Gas and Electric to keep changes from being made that would have allowed any new nuclear power

plants from being built in Oregon.

Cross believes most people are "dissatisfied with

politics as usual" and are ready for change. He says outside business needs encouraging.

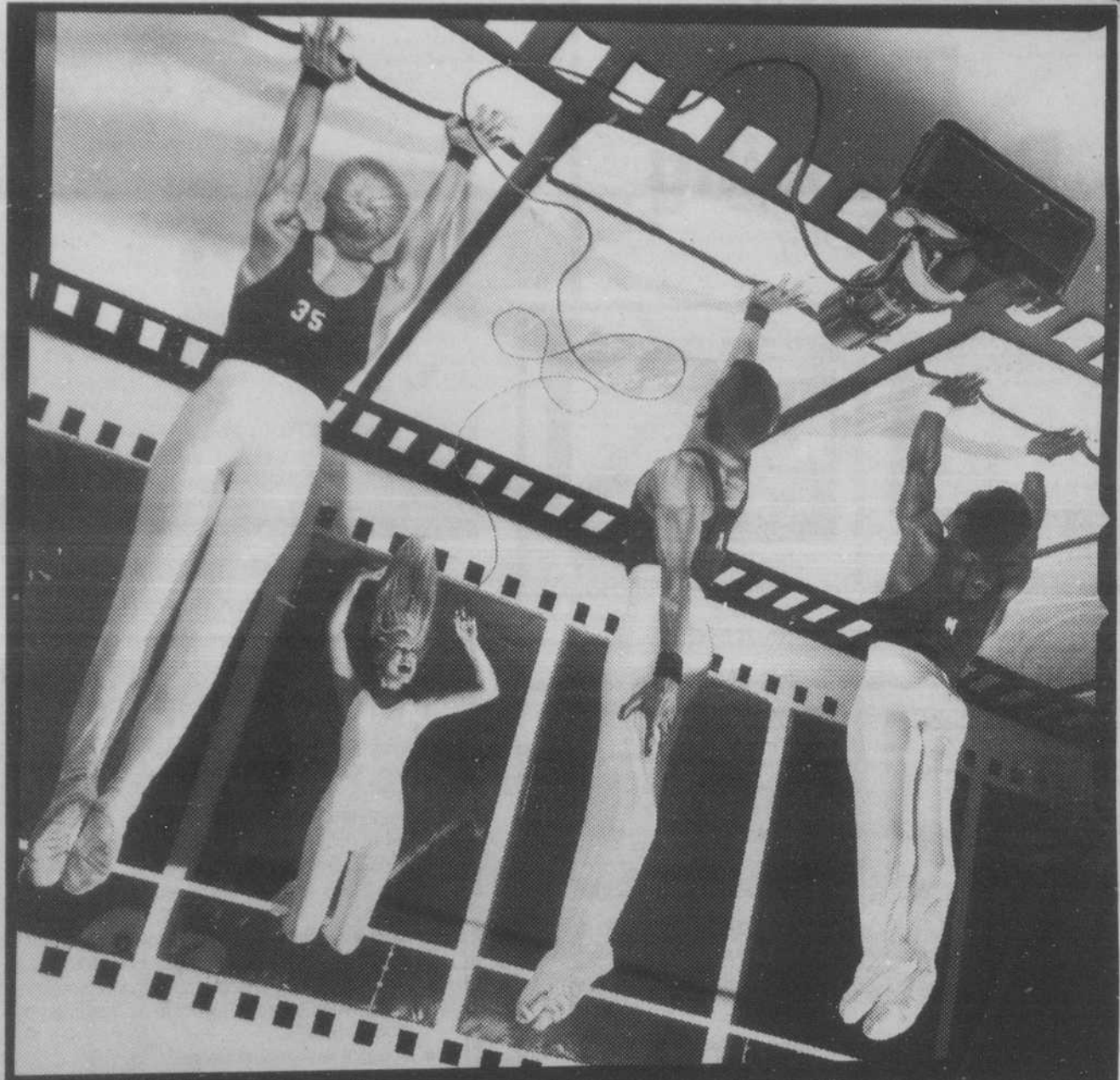
