

Group goals cut in IFC hearing

Only one group requesting incidental fee funding had all its goals approved by the Incidental Fee Committee Thursday, although the committee approved a majority of the goals of two other new student programs.

The committee approved all three goals of the University Song and Dance Troupe with the provision that the funds

be spent only on costumes and music.

The campus chapter of American Advertising Federation had two of five goals rejected because they would not benefit the University, as required by IFC rules.

The committee unanimously voted against a goal to fund films and presentations "that are helpful in securing post-college employment."

Regular museum hours are noon to 5 p.m., Wednesday through Sunday, except holidays. For more information, call the museum at 686-3027.

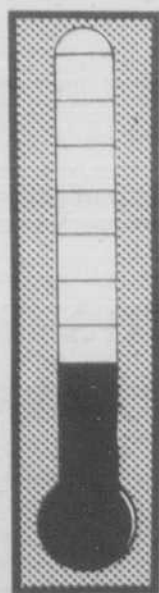
Reagan's claims 'misstatements'

PORTLAND, (AP) — U.S. Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., said Thursday that a Reader's Digest article that says that foreign agents instigated the American nuclear-arms freeze movement is inaccurate.

In a news conference a week ago, President Reagan said foreign agents were responsible for instigating the nuclear-freeze movement.

"It is full of misstatements, untruths," Hatfield said from Washington.
