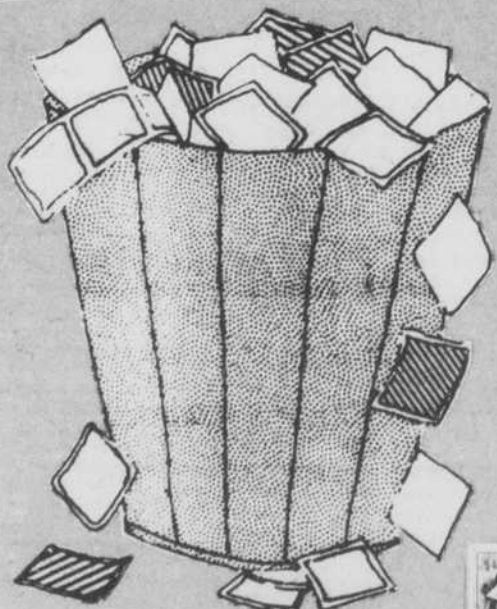

**Miami not perfect**

**TAMPA, Fla. (AP)** — Tampa Bay safety Neil Colzie intercepted two fourth-quarter passes, one of which set up James Wilder's 2-yard touchdown run, as the Buccaneers held on for a 23-17 National Football League triumph over the previously unbeaten Miami Dolphins Monday night.

The victory was the first of the strike-shortened season for the defending National Conference Central champions and left the Washington Redskins as the only NFL team with an unblemished record after four games.

The 3-1 Dolphins dropped into a five-way tie for the lead in the American Conference. Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, Buffalo,

New York Jets and Los Angeles Raiders also own 3-1 records.

Colzie, a Miami native and former Dolphin, picked off a Don Strock pass at the Tampa Bay 35 and returned it 51 yards to the Dolphins 14 to set up Wilder's score.

The touchdown, with 8:27 remaining to play, took the wind out of a Miami comeback engineered by Strock.

Tampa Bay built a 6-3 halftime lead on a pair of Bill Capece field goals and moved out to a 13-3 advantage with 3:20 remaining in the third quarter when quarterback Doug Williams ran the final 3 yards of a 38-yard touchdown drive.

Bucs free safety Cedrick Brown intercepted a Strock pass and returned it 24 yards to set up Capece's third field goal of the game, a 36-yarder as Tampa Bay led 16-3 after three quarters.

Strock, who replaced starter David Woodley at the outset of the second half, moved the Dolphins back into contention with a seven-play, 68-yard drive leading to his 7-yard touchdown toss to tight end Joe Rose. Strock later teamed with Rose on a 12-yard touchdown play which cut Miami's deficit to 23-17 with 34 seconds remaining.

**Hill third  
at nationals**

**EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP)** — Oregon's Jim Hill finished third at the U.S. Cross Country Championships Sunday, just getting edged out by NCAA winner Mark Scrutton by one second.

Pat Porter, of Adams State and Athletics West won the race with a time of 28:50 over the 10,000-meter course, 17 seconds ahead of Scrutton.

**Ducks lose  
in overtime**

**ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP)** — Center Bob Thornton scored Cal-Irvine's final six points in overtime Monday night as the Anteaters downed Oregon 46-44 in a non-conference basketball game.

Thornton, who had a game-high 14 points, gave Cal-Irvine the margin it needed when he sank a pair of free throws to make it 46-42 with 2:58 remaining in overtime.

The Ducks lost a chance for a second overtime when Paul Bain missed a 15-foot jumper three seconds before the game ended.

The score was 40-40 at the end of regulation time.

Forward David Brantley led Oregon scoring with 12 points. Blair Rasmussen added 10 points for the Ducks, Jerry Adams scored seven.

Cal-Irvine led 25-24 at halftime, but Oregon took a 32-27 edge midway through the second half.

**Ducks' guards  
hit bad luck**

The Oregon women's basketball team ran into bad luck after three of their guards suffered injuries.

Standout freshman Laurie Tennant may be the biggest loss for the Ducks after she severely sprained her left ankle in the second half of the Ducks' win over DePaul Saturday.

Tennant, who is the second leading scorer on the Ducks with an 11.8 point average, is in a full leg cast for at least six weeks. She is not expected to play until mid-January.

Janet Harris, a sophomore from The Dalles re-injured a knee she had had surgery on two years ago and is listed as doubtful for the Ducks' next game against Portland State Dec. 10.

Penny Gienger, who has averaged 4.5 points a game for the Ducks this season is out for 10 days after spraining an ankle.
