## AIA decisions Duck matmen

Athletes In Action, sparked by back-to-back pins, had a fairly easy time with Oregon's wrestlers Thursday night, decisioning the Ducks 31-14 in a dual meet at McArthur Court.

AIA's 177-pounder Dan Morrison, a 1980 NAIA champion,

pinned Duck freshman Keith Miller at 1:40 of the first round, then Drew Whitfield sealed the Ducks' fate by pinning Oregon's Brett Hamilton with 48 seconds left in the second period in the 190-pound match.

The pins gave AIA a 27-14 advantage and that was improved on by Stephen Burak's 11-3 decision over the Ducks'

Scott Ames in the heavyweight division.

"They're a good team; definitely a good team," Oregon coach Ron Finley said of the Christian squad from Canada. "We had a couple of good performances, but we definitely have some things to improve on. We're still coming slow."

One of the "good" performances Finley noted was Charles Nutter's 13-6 decision over Gary Almquist in the 167-pound class.

"Nutter opened up and started shooting," Finley said of the sophomore.

The match opened with a 9-9 tie between Oregon senior Mike Erb and AIA four-year veteran Frank Harl. With the score tied 2-2, Oregon's Miles Hancock decisioned Greg Fetzer 7-4 to give the Ducks a 5-2 advantage.

After the Ducks' Travis Hancock, brother of Miles, won by forfeit in the 134-pound division, two-time NCAA champ Dan Cuestas gave the Duck freshman John Borich a 20-3 wrestling lesson. Thus, AIA closed the team score gap to 11-7.

AIA took the lead when Jesse Castro decisioned freshman Randy Barkhurst 17-6 in the 150-pound match.

Steve Suder cushioned a lead AIA would never relinquish with a 4-1 decision over junior Rick O'Shea in the 158-pound division.

"Suder beat Rick last summer in the AAU tournament. Rick made a big mistake by getting his elbow too high, but he (O'Shea) got the crowd reacting with a couple of moves," Finley said of the Harrisburg native.

The Ducks have a 1-3 dual meet record heading into Friday's match at Portland State, although the AIA match is not official.

### Blazers win

OAKLAND (AP) — Jim Paxson sent Portland ahead by making a 15-foot jump shot with five minutes remaining and the Trail Blazers pulled away to a 107-98 National Basketball Association victory over the Golden State Warriors Thursday night.

Portland ended its season record at 11-11.
