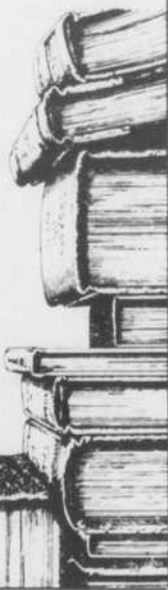

AP picks Decker Tabb year's athlete

NEW YORK (AP) — Record-shattering Mary Decker Tabb, the best woman's distance runner in American history, was named winner of The Associated Press' Female Athlete of the Year Award for 1982 Thursday.

The 24-year-old Tabb, the first woman track and field athlete to win the honor since Chi Cheng in 1970, received 29 votes in the annual balloting by sports writers and broadcasters.

Tennis player Martina Navratilova finished second with 21 votes and golfer JoAnne Carner was third with 9. The 1981 winner, tennis player Tracy Austin, failed to receive a vote this time.

"Wow!" the surprised Tabb exclaimed after learning of the award. "That's great. It's a great honor. I like for people to know what I'm doing."

"It also means that people are

beginning to recognize women's track and field athletes. Since I've been running (since she was 11 years old), it doesn't seem we have been recognized as we should."

Indoors, she shattered the world best in the mile three times, lowering it the last time to 4 minutes, 20.5 seconds, and reduced the world bests in the 2,000 meters to 5:53.4 and the 3,000 to 8:47.3.

Outdoors, she was just as impressive, before an injured left Achilles' tendon prematurely ended her season in August. Prior to the injury, she cracked world records in the mile (4:18.08, later reduced to 4:17.44 by Romania's Maricica Puica), 5,000 meters (15:08.26) and 10,000 meters (31:35.3), and set an American record for 3,000 meters (8:29.71, the second fastest clocking in history).

Ducks dunked by fifth-ranked UCLA

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Darrin Daye, Kenny Field and Rod Foster scored 17 points each to lead fifth-ranked UCLA to a 97-69 Pacific 10 Conference basketball victory over Oregon Thursday night.

Brad Wright added 16 points

for the Bruins, who lead the conference with a 3-0 record and 10-1 overall.

Blair Rasmussen scored 22 points for the Ducks who fell to 1-2 in the Pac-10 and 5-7 overall.

UCLA held a 40-30 halftime

lead, but Oregon rallied early in the second half and cut the UCLA advantage to one point on three occasions. UCLA's lead was only 60-56 with 11 minutes remaining but the Bruins ran off 15 unanswered points to take a 75-56 lead and were never seriously threatened after that.

The Ducks will take on USC next.

It's a tall order but Ducks ready

They may be small in numbers, with only four girls on the team, but the Oregon gymnastic team has a big job in front of it as they take on NorPac rival Washington State tonight at 7 p.m. in Gerlinger Annex.

The Cougars placed 11th in the nation last year and Coach Ed Boyd expects a big squad to invade Eugene. "They are really strong in the floor exercise and vaulting areas," Boyd said. The Ducks will counter with top vaulter, Julie Tennenhouse and floor exercise leader and top all-around, Tracy Manduchi.

It doesn't get any easier for the Ducks after tonight's meet as they travel to Corvallis for a three way meet with host Oregon State and Washington.

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
