## Oregon marches Vikings off plank

Jim Hildebrand continues to help fill a large void for the Oregon wrestling team.

Hildebrand, a fifth-year senior who has not had much mat time in his years at Oregon, beat Mike Hubbard of Portland State 18-7 Wednesday night to help the Ducks upend the Vikings 20-17 in a dual wrestling match at McArthur Court.

In the absence of 150-pound starter Rick O'Shea, who was felled by an injured knee a couple of weeks ago, Hildebrand has stepped in and performed admirably for the Ducks. Hildebrand raised his season record to 2-0 with his victory against Portland State.

"He (Hildebrand) has to get in better shape but I really appreciate his efforts," said Oregon wrestling coach Ron Finley. "Jimmy has been in and out of school for a couple of years for various reasons. He has had a lot of injuries. It is vital that we have Hildebrand in the lineup while O'Shea is out."

The match started off on the wrong foot for the Ducks as Oregon's 118-pounder Mike Erb dropped a 7-6 decision to Portland State's Anthony Amado.

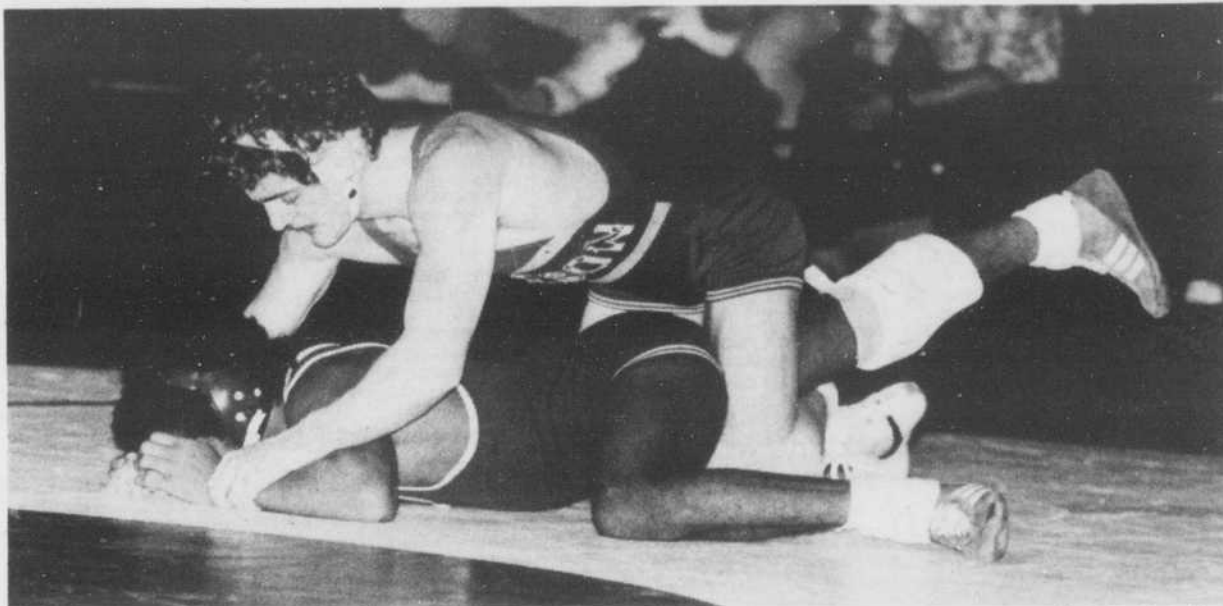

At 126 pounds, Miles Hancock won the first of four Duck wins in a row as he pinned Todd Davis in 4:49. Tim Curtiss, Lorenzo West and Hildebrand each won matches at 134, 142 and 150 pounds before Portland State recorded its second victory of the match.

With the team score standing at 16-3 in favor of Oregon, Portland State's Lloyd Hygelund

beat Oregon's Zane Kesey. But at 167 pounds, Oregon's James Terry sealed the Duck win with a victory over Slade Kitchens 10-2 to make the score 20-6.

Portland State's Kevin Benson beat Charles Nutter, Scott Mansur defeated Scott Ames and Karl Pope whipped Drew Smetana in the last three matches of the night.

"Most of our guys wrestled

very well tonight," said Finley. "Erb beat Amado for 7:50 of the match but just made a mistake at the end."

"I was scared to death until the second of the last match. Lenny (Kauffman, Portland State Coach) is a hell of a coach at putting his wrestlers at just the right weights."

The Ducks raised their season record to 4-7.

## Blazers only go first class on the road

**PORTLAND (AP)** — The coaches won't go coach but neither will the players.

That's why the Portland Trail Blazers took two separate flights to Dallas Wednesday — the result of an arbitrator's ruling and the players' insistence on first class travel.

The National Basketball Players Association contract with the NBA requires first class seating for all players on flights lasting more than an hour.

The Trail Blazers have always traveled on one plane, so there sometimes weren't enough first

class seats to go around. When that happened some of the players were bumped to the "coach" or second class section.

An arbitrator recently ruled that players can't be bumped to the coach seats because of the NBPA-NBA contract. The Blazers didn't want to put their coaches in coach, so they split the team.

"In the past, when there haven't been enough first class seats, we have designated players, based on service and playing time, who will go

coach," said Blazer vice president Harry Glickman.

"The players association now insists that all players must go first class, that they have priority over everyone, including the coaches," he said.

"We're not going to fly the coaches in the coach section, so all we can do is split up the group so that there will be enough first class seats available," Glickman said.

Blazers' player representative Jim Paxson said the team has been good about travel but the players association wants to enforce the first class seating rule as a matter of principle.

"I hope we won't find that it's too disruptive," he said. "On this trip (to Dallas, San Antonio and Houston) we'll have three flights where we don't go as one group. We'll look at this trip and reevaluate it when we get back."

## Ron Burns leaves Oregon squad

Ron Burns, the 7-foot reserve center on the Oregon basketball team has left the squad.

Oregon coach Jim Haney said that junior from Tacoma left the team for personal reasons.

Burns played in nine of the Ducks' 13 games and scored 21 points in 67 minutes this year.

Last season, Burns was forced to sit out because of a congenital back ailment.

## Nehemiah reinstated

**LOS ANGELES (AP)** — In a precedent-setting move, hurdler Renaldo Nehemiah was given permission Wednesday to compete as an amateur in track and field events in the United States despite being a professional football player with the San Francisco 49ers.

The decision marks the first time a professional in another sport — other than a college athlete — has been allowed to compete as an amateur in track and field.
