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Reagan looks to break arms deadlock

WASHINGTON (AP) — Pres. Ronald Reagan is considering new steps to break the bargaining deadlock with the Soviet Union over U.S. proposals to eliminate medium-range nuclear missiles in Europe, Vice President George Bush said Sunday.

Bush, who returned Thursday from a seven-nation European trip, suggested an interim agreement might be the best way to achieve the administration's goal of a total ban on medium-range weapons.

An interim pact presumably would call for a reduction in the current Soviet arsenal of missiles aimed at Western Eu-

rope, and a cutback in the number of new Pershing II and cruise missiles that the United States is scheduled to begin deploying in NATO countries at the end of this year.

"He will be making a determination whether we should do something different in order to

encourage the Soviets to do what we've asked," Bush said on CBS-TV's "Face the Nation."

He insisted, however, "we are not going to depart from this moral objective, ridding the world, if you will, banishing forever an entire generation of these weapons."

Hinkley attempts suicide still in serious condition

WASHINGTON (AP) — John Hinckley Jr., found innocent by reason of insanity of shooting Pres. Ronald Reagan, was ho-

spitalized in serious condition Sunday after an apparent suicide attempt, authorities said.

Hinckley, connected to a respirator, may be in danger of dying, but "he is stable and we believe he'll be all right," said Dr. James Levy, president of Greater Southeast Community Hospital, where Hinckley was taken. "We will not be able to tell you for certainty for the next 24 to 48 hours whether he's out of the woods."

The incident was at least the third apparent suicide attempt by Hinckley since he shot and wounded the president and three other men outside the Washington Hilton Hotel in March 1981.

Hinckley, 27, was found semiconscious at about 8:30 a.m. Sunday on the floor of his room at St. Elizabeths Hospital, where he has been in indefinite confinement since last year's trial, said Wayne Pines, a spokesman for St. Elizabeths.

Conservationists won't file suit over wilderness

EUGENE (AP) — A spokesman for a coalition of Oregon conservation groups said Sunday his organization won't file suit to protect federal wilderness lands, at least until a congressional subcommittee takes action.

James Monteith, executive director of the Oregon Natural Resource Council, said council members met Saturday in Bend to discuss filing the suit. He said they agreed to wait for the results of a hearing Monday on a bill that would add about 1.1 million acres of wilderness land in Oregon.

The hearing is being held in Washington by a House subcommittee on Public Lands and National Parks.

Monteith said details of the council's decision would be made public at simultaneous news conferences Monday at 11 a.m. at the group's Eugene headquarters and in the Dekum building in Portland.

The council, which represents 85 Oregon groups interested in conservation, is concerned about a Reagan administration decision that will allow mining and logging on potential wilderness area lands while a third wilderness review is conducted.

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
