EMU or the athletic department's ticket subsidy.

"I think they set up arbitrary guidelines and stick to them," said another student who requested anonymity.

Some students who think the IFC does a good job said they occasionally disagree with committee decisions but believe the committee does a good job overall.

SUAB is the least-known student government organization. According to the survey, 70 percent of the students do not know if the board does a good job, while the remaining 30 percent said SUAB does a good job.

"They keep us quite informed," said Thomas Hemenway, a rhetoric and communication senior. "They generally have the students interests at heart."

The ASUO president's office does a good job according to 40 percent of the surveyed students. Fifteen percent think the office does a poor job, and 45 percent are undecided.

Two undecided students said they do not know who the ASUO president is, while a third student said he didn't know the president has a campus office.

Some students who thought the ASUO president's office does a good job said they based their answer on the president's ability to avoid trouble.

"He seems to have avoided any major controversies," said Larry Adams, a first-year law student. "That's the best you can expect."

The office needs to publicize itself more and encourage more students to come in and talk, said Lisa

Goff, a chemistry junior.

The survey results did not surprise ASUO Pres. C.J. Balfe.

"I think it's very representative, even if it's unscientific," Balfe said Monday.

The ASUO has publicized its services in Emerald articles and advertisements, including weekly program ads, but students still are uninformed, he said.

"It's harder than hell to get them to understand what we do," Balfe said. The president said he is "fresh out of ideas" on how to publicize student government.

IFC Chairer Betzy Fry said most governing bodies that handle money are criticized. Students do not understand the budgeting process, Fry said.

"Most program directors do not understand the budgeting process," she said. And if the program directors do not understand the process, most students wouldn't either, Fry said.

SUAB Chairer Dan Allen said the SUAB results showing apparent satisfaction with the board's performance surprised him. He expected some dissatisfaction.

Students apparently are becoming more informed about the SUAB's functions, although no previous polls exist to compare the Emerald's results with, Allen said.

But the board will keep trying to make their services known to the large number of students who do know about SUAB, he said.

"We're in the same boat with everyone else in student government," Allen said.

Tax hearing to be held

The House Revenue committee will hold a public meeting at Harris Hall in downtown Eugene tonight at 7:30 p.m.

The hearing will probably focus on tax reform, especially the sales tax and property tax relief, according to Terry Drake, an economist with the

committee. He says the testimony may move toward the general fund budget because of community interest in the University.

Drake says the committee has been traveling around the state to try to get input from citizens about tax reform.

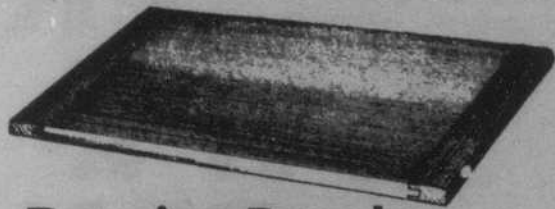
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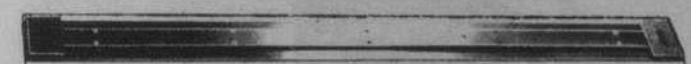
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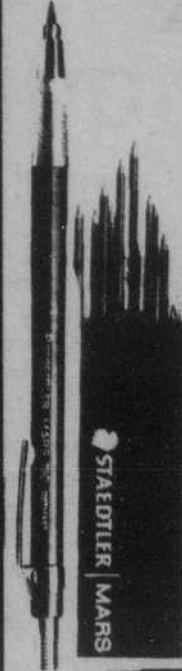
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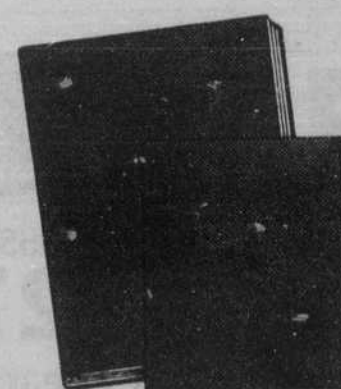
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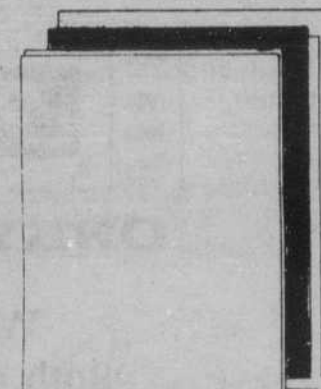
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
