

Walker zooms leads Generals past Federals

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — Herschel Walker scored two touchdowns and became the United States Football League's leading rusher with a 143-yard effort as the New Jersey Generals edged the Washington Federals 23-22 Sunday.

Washington's Ken Olson missed a 33-yard field goal with eight seconds left as the Federals' fourth-quarter rally just fell short.

Walker, whose longest run was 38 yards, scored on a 2-yard run midway through the second quarter and dashed into the end zone from 8 yards out on the first play of the fourth quarter.

The Generals boosted their record to 2-5, while the Federals fell to 1-6.

Joe Gilliam, once a starter for the Pittsburgh Steelers, came off the bench in the second quarter with the Federals trailing 14-2 and guided their comeback bid with three touchdown passes.

The Generals tallied 17 points in the second quarter, scoring on Bobby Scott's 40-yard pass play to Victor Hicks, Walker's 2-yard burst and Dave Jacobs' 32-yard field goal to take a 17-8 halftime lead.

Michigan blitz by Chicago

PONTIAC, Mich. (AP) — Rookie John Williams ran 31 yards for a touchdown Sunday and became the first Michigan runner to turn in a 100-yard game as he sparked the Panthers to a 17-12 United States Football League victory over the Chicago Blitz.

After spotting the Blitz a 6-3 halftime lead, Michigan took the second-half kickoff and moved 72 yards in four plays. Williams gained 24 yards on the second play and ran 31 yards up the middle for the TD that put the Panthers ahead for good.

Williams finished with 133 yards on 19 carries.

The Panthers improved their record to 3-4 while Chicago, also a member of the Central Division, slipped to 4-3.

Michigan fullback Ken Lacy had a 9-yard touchdown run later in the third quarter and Chicago's Kevin Long scored on a 1-yard plunge in the fourth quarter.

Chicago kicker Frank Corral booted a 25-yard field goal in the first quarter and boomed a 45-yarder in the second period. Michigan's Novo Bujovic kicked a 20-yard field goal with 2:00 remaining in the first half.

Softballers run into cold streak at plate

The ups and downs continued for the Oregon women's softball team last Friday as the Ducks managed one win in three attempts at the Reno Invitational Tournament, and then dropped a doubleheader to the University of Pacific Sunday.

Oregon lost its opening-round game to Chico State by the score of 2-0. Offensive problems continue to plague the Ducks as they managed only four hits in the whitewashing. Oregon pitching ace Stephanie Heisler took the

loss despite a strong effort on the mound.

Things got much better in the Ducks' next game as the lifeless bats finally began to stir in a 12-0 demolition of Santa Clara. Tami Caldwell, who has proved to be the Ducks' most consistent pitcher, shut out Santa Clara as Oregon claimed its second win of the spring. Caldwell walked only one batter while her teammates committed only one error to aid her cause.

The win moved the Ducks into the consolation cham-

pionship game where Idaho State tacked another 2-0 loss on Oregon.

The Duck offense went dry again, managing just five hits. Heisler kept her team in the game with another strong pitching performance.

Oregon had no better luck as they dropped a 10-0 and a 3-0 doubleheader to Pacific.

Western Oregon State will be the next opponent for the softballers in a home contest scheduled to begin at 3 p.m. Tuesday at the softball field south of Hayward Field.

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
