

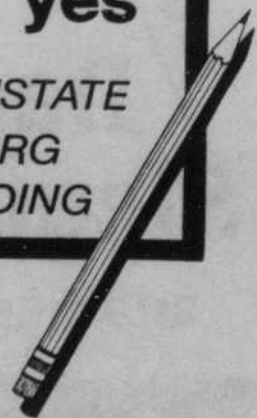


ERIC ENGLUND SCHOLARSHIP
