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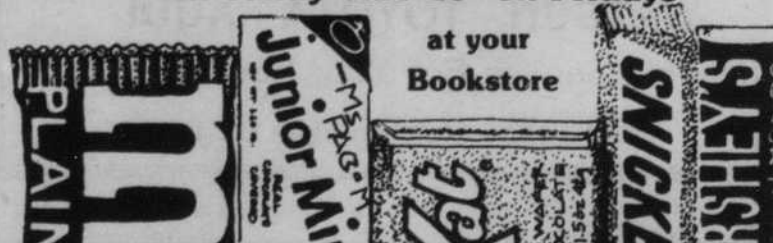
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Portland hopes Jabbar can't stay hot

PORTLAND (AP) — Portland's Mychal Thompson — always an optimist — figures Kareem Abdul-Jabbar won't be able to continue to tear apart the Trail Blazers.

"As great as he is, he can't keep scoring as much as he has been in the past two games," Thompson says.

Abdul-Jabbar and the rest of the Los Angeles Lakers arrived here Thursday afternoon to prepare for Friday night's third game of their National Basketball Association playoff series with Portland.

The 7-foot-2 center has been phenomenal as the Lakers grabbed a 2-0 lead in their best-of-seven Western Conference semifinal matchup.

"He's been making some very tough shots," Thompson says, "even when we're double- and triple-teaming him. I think he's going to start missing some."

Jabbar has hit 26 of 35 shots and scored 69 points in the two Blazer victories.

"He's played two magnificent games," says Portland coach Jack Ramsay. "He's thrown in some incredible shots."

The veteran Portland coach says his team can do a better job of defending the Los Angeles center.

"He's getting to his strength too often," Ramsay says. "We can't let him get in the lane so easily."

With the Los Angeles bench depleted by injuries, Lakers' Coach Pat Riley has had to leave Jabbar in the game longer than usual. The 36-year-old center, whose contract expires after this season, played 44 minutes Tuesday night.

Jabbar says he doesn't mind.

"It's been a luxury playing fewer minutes the last two years," he says. "We had other people. I'm ready to play more."

When Jabbar has been unable to shoot, he often has found an open Laker for an uncontested jump shot or lay-up.

"I'm used to options," he says. "When they did not

double-team me, I went straight for the hole. When they doubled on me, I looked for the pass."

"It doesn't make any difference if he's double-teamed," Riley says. "Once he gets into the air, it doesn't matter if four guys are on him. He worked himself free (Tuesday). It's nothing new. We've seen it all year."

Thompson figures the noisy Portland crowd will make it difficult for Jabbar and the rest of the Lakers. The Blazers' 270th consecutive sellout crowd is expected Friday night.

"They don't like to play up here," Thompson says. "Our history is that we have been very successful against them up here, even with this great team they have now."

Friday's game starts at 8:30 p.m. It will be televised by CBS live in the East and on a delayed basis in most other areas. It will be shown live in Portland, because the game was sold out 24 hours before the tipoff.

The fourth game is set for 12:30 p.m. Sunday.

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Ducks drop doublebill

Like the big fish that got away, the Oregon women's softball team dropped a NorPac doubleheader to highly touted California by the margins of 3-0 and 1-0. The twin-bill whitewashings dropped the Ducks to 4-13 for the year.

In the second game, Oregon was tied with Cal until the top of the seventh inning when the Bears notched home a run with two outs.

The loss ruined a superb performance by the Ducks' hard luck pitcher Stephanie Heisler. Heisler whose record fell to 1-8, was victimized by a nonexistent Oregon offense. The Ducks could only muster three hits for the entire day against Cal pitching.

Last years NCAA World Series runner up, the Fresno State Bulldogs visit the Ducks today for a doubleheader scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. at Oregon field.

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
