



Environmentalists protest road

More than 30 members and sympathizers of the environmental group Earth First staged a peaceful march yesterday, parading from the EMU to the Federal Building in downtown Eugene.

The purpose of the march according to Mike Roselle, one of the march organizers, was to call attention to the group's blockade of Forest Service attempts to build a road in the Bald Mt. area of Southern Oregon.

Roselle, coordinator of the blockade, says Earth First wants to stop construction of the road to save old-growth timber in the forest and the only way to do that is to show the people of the state and country they are serious.

"We're trying to use nonviolent direct intervention," he says, adding that the only law the group has broken is disorderly conduct.

Kathleen Hart, an English major, won the \$50 Graduate Poegram Award in Poetry.
