Oregon winegrowers serve 'best of the grape' at Eugene Celebration

The Southern Willamette Region of the Oregon Winegrower's Association will present a European-flavored "Weinstube" (Wine Garden) during the Eugene Celebration, on Sept. 30, Oct. 1 and 2.

Award-winning wines from the Umpqua, Willamette, and Rogue Valley regions will be featured.

On Friday, Reislings, a Gewurtztraminer, red and white table wines, and two varieties of fruit wines from the Umpqua and Willamette Valley regions will be served.

A similar selection from the Willamette Valley Region will be served Saturday, along with Pinot Noir and Pinot Blanc wines.

On Sunday, Chardonnays, Reislings, fruits and a Pinot Noir from the Rogue Region will be featured.

Vineyards represented are Henry, Forgeron, Alpine, Hinman, Bjelland, Oak Knoll, Amity, Knudsen-Erath, Ponzi, Valley View, and Siskiyou.

Organizers of the Weinstube have made a special effort to serve Eugene Celebration participation with "the best of the grape" from state vineyards and wineries. Many of the selections have won bronze, gold or silver medals from the Oregon State Fair.

A glass of wine will be served for \$1.50 (no one under 21 admitted). Johan's french bread and wine-by-the-bottle will be sold.

Swing Shift, a local jazz quintet, will entertain festival goers on Saturday from 6-8 p.m.

The wine garden will be located on the west end of the downtown mall, near Burch's Shoes. Hours will be noon to 8 p.m. Friday, Saturday, noon to 5 p.m. Sunday.

Wine festivals are immensely popular in Europe, particularly at harvest time. A variety of food and wine is served, with entertainment throughout the day.

EPA rules leaked to some companies

WASHINGTON (AP) — A former Environmental Protection Agency official said Tuesday the Reagan administration gave companies regulated by the EPA advance notice of the agency's proposed environmental regulations.

John E. Daniel, former EPA chief of staff, told Congress that in late 1981, a General Electric official called the agency to ask for additional time to comment on regulations on high-level radioactive waste — rules that had not been publicly released.

Daniel told the House Energy and Commerce oversight subcommittee the proposals had been sent to the Office of Management and Budget for review.

On other occasions, Daniel said, the OMB analyses on proposed regulations were "so technical they would have come from someone other than OMB staff. They would have had to come from the regulated companies. I have received calls from regulated industries where they had knowledge of the (unpublished) regulations."
