

A Not-so-Civil War

Ducks look for ninth straight over OSU

It'll be Civil War time Saturday when Oregon's football team, 4-6, faces Pac-10 doormat Oregon State, 2-8, at Autzen Stadium.

The cliches say to throw out records, but forget the cliches — in recent years Oregon has taken command of this series and put OSU in its hip pocket.

While the Ducks have only a slight edge in the 86-year rivalry (40-37-9), they have won the last eight meetings, including a 7-6 win last season in Corvallis. Oregon State hasn't beaten the Ducks since a 35-16 win in 1974.

The biggest edge in Civil War games belongs to Oregon coach Rich Brooks. As a player and coach at OSU and Oregon, Brooks has amassed a 15-0-1 Civil War record.

With a ninth straight win over OSU Saturday, Oregon would finish 5-6 overall and 4-3 in Pac-10 play.

This year's contest figures to be a game which will be won on the ground, as the Ducks will start freshman quarterback Chris Miller while the Beavers counter with walk-on Ladd McKittrick (a 38-percent passer).

"The team that wins will probably be the team that runs the football the best," says Oregon State coach Joe Avezzano. "We have stumbled some on offense, but I feel that our running overall has been good."

Mostly, senior tailback Bryce Oglesby has been good — he leads OSU with 782 yards.

For the Ducks, Miller will start his second game. In a 16-7 win over Stanford University, he showed signs that he can run (he had a 23-yard keeper) as well as pass (nine for 15).

"He has improved tremendously over the last two months — he is starting to understand the game

at this level," says Oregon offensive coordinator Bob Toledo.

When Miller isn't throwing, he'll often hand off to senior Ladaria Johnson, who leads the Ducks with 376 yards on 78 carries.

But, as usual, the Ducks would like to get the football into the hands of electrifying Lew Barnes. Barnes has caught a team-leading 26 passes this season for 568 yards and ranks third in the nation in punt returns with a 14.8 average.

"We can't afford to give up the big play," says Avezzano, referring to the abilities of Barnes. "But since we have made them (including a 92-yard McKittrick TD pass to Reggie Bynum) and they have made them, big plays will probably play some sort of role."

A plus for Oregon's offense is a suddenly healthy offensive line. Guard Gary Zimmerman, projected this week by Sports II-


lustrated as a first-round National Football League pick, is Oregon's standout lineman. He has returned to health following a knee injury.
