First meeting established for support group

A support group for students who have family or friends with cancer, or who have lost a friend or family member to cancer, will hold its first meeting tonight at 7:30 p.m. in Century room D of the EMU.

Jeanne Wojack, a co-facilitator of Sacred Heart's cancer support group and a counselor at the Bright Wings counseling center, will be the guest speaker.

The idea for the group was originated by Leslie Hickcox, a graduate teaching fellow in the School and Community Health department, after she lectured about the affects of losing a family member to cancer.

Tonight's meeting, sponsored by the American Cancer Society, will culminate by breaking into small discussion groups, and the small group format will be continued in later meetings, Hickcox says.

She plans to hold two to three small meetings a month discussing the process of supporting someone dealing with cancer. Topics will include the grief process and stress related grief.

Hickcox lost her father to cancer in December and says the experience of dealing with a family member with terminal illness has affected her career and her life.

"There's a strange, long-term tension," she says.
