It appears strange to us that the two Europeans quoted on the front page of the April 9 *Emerald* are represented by Paul Ertelt as speaking for the entire European population. How can he assume that two out of 250,000,000 persons contribute a representative segment of the aforesaid population? Perhaps it is also worth mentioning that having lived most of our adult lives in Europe, we must confess to never having heard of the European Democratic Students. Have you? Has Ertelt?

Public opinion polls in West Germany last year indicated that 70 percent of the adult population opposed deployment of the new missiles. In West Germany last October, 1.3 million people took the trouble to participate in a nationwide demonstration against these additional nuclear arms on their soil.
