Thelen returns to the *Emerald* after nine months as an advertising representative for *The Dalles Chronicle*. Prior to that, Thelen worked for three years as a student in the *Emerald's* advertising department.

She estimates having successfully handled between 84 and 93 accounts while working at the *Chronicle*. Because of the paper's smaller size, Thelen was also involved in taking pictures, typesetting, layout and other production functions.

"I was very lucky to assume this position because I had the previous background," Thelen

says. "It wasn't like I got the job because I used to work here," she adds.

Currently, there are seven students working in advertising, but she will add two positions soon, including an internship, she says. "I'm always looking for good, motivated students to work up here," Thelen says.

Though the period at the *Emerald* was helpful in understanding working with students, Thelen says it was her experience at the *Chronicle* — in the real world — that provided her with a more professional attitude.

"It was important for me to make that break from Eugene so I could come back again," she says.
