## New rulings for hunters

The US Fish and Wildlife Service has published a final rule outlining regulations governing hunting on national wildlife refuges. The rule describes the specific regulations governing hunting programs for migratory game birds, upland game and big game for each refuge.

The rule, published in the Sep. 19 Federal Register, does not add any new refuges to the list of those open to hunting. Instead, it codifies all existing refuge hunting regulations as part of the Code of Federal Regulations. These regulations will remain in place unless amended by subsequent regulations which will be published in the Register.

The Service is taking this ac-

tion to improve administration of the hunt programs by eliminating the need to publish each refuge's hunting regulations in the Federal Register each year. Annual publication is costly and in the past has delayed timely issuance of the regulations.

The ruling also includes two new general provisions applying to all refuges with hunt programs. The first prohibits unauthorized distribution of bait and hunting over bait. The second prohibits the use of nails, wire, screws or bolts to attach hunting stands to trees or hunting from a tree into which a metal object has been driven in order to support a hunter.

order to support a hunter. A supplemental proposed rule correcting several errors and oversights in the original proposal was published in the Sep. 10 Federal Register.
