"There seemed to be a need for it to be done," says Simpson of the continuation. "I guess when the need isn't there, I'll quit." Even the Oregon cheerleaders don't mind the competition.

"The fans seem to love him," said Duck cheerleader Kym Easton. "He seems to get the crowd going and he definitely has quite a lot of followers," added yell leader Rick Schaufler. Schaufler.

Simpson has been living in Eugene since 1979. He works in advertising firm when he isn't out on the field leading cheers on Saturday afternoons.


"Oregon's got good fans," says Simpson. "They just have to be charged up."






