

Students must apply for graduation today

Consider this fair warning: If you plan to graduate at the end of winter or spring term and plan to participate in the June 16 commencement exercises, you should apply for graduation today by 5 p.m. at the Registrar's office in Oregon Hall.

Both undergraduates and graduate students finishing winter term must apply for graduation today. Following application, undergraduate students will receive a copy of their records for final review by an advisor.

Today is also the preferred deadline for spring term graduates to file the form, although the last deadline is Apr. 12.

The application tells the University what name to put on the diploma and where to send it once you've graduated.

As an added benefit, the form also notifies the alumni office of your impending graduation, so you will continue to receive news from the University.

AAUP to discuss future of higher ed

The Oregon Conference of the American Association of University Professors will hold a statewide meeting in Corvallis Saturday.

A complimentary continental breakfast will be served at 9:30 a.m., and newly-elected Senate President John Kitzhaber will give a keynote address at 10 a.m.

After the address, a six-member panel of higher education officials will discuss changes in higher education. The panel is comprised of Bud Davis, Chancellor of the Oregon State System of Higher Education, Tony Van Vliet, member of the Oregon House of Representatives and four college and university presidents, including University President Paul Olum.

Mark Nelson, Association of Oregon Faculties lobbyist, will conduct a workshop on lobbying for faculty at the end of the meeting.

The meeting will be in Peavy Auditorium at Oregon State University in Corvallis.

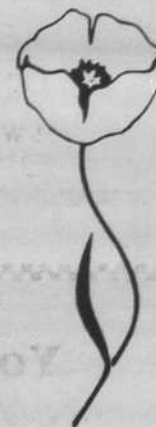
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'Hard Times in Humboldt'

Committee will hold tax inquiry

Oregon House Revenue Committee hearings on the sales tax will begin Monday with Gov. Vic Atiyeh testifying on behalf of his sales-tax proposal.

In November, Atiyeh proposed a five percent sales tax he hopes will relieve property tax rates by providing an additional \$750 million to support local schools and community colleges.

The week-long hearings will be held in Hearing Room A at the State Capitol Building in Salem, Mon. through Fri. from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. There also will be a session Wed. at 7 p.m.
