Networks vow not to project

NEW YORK (AP) — ABC, CBS and NBC have agreed not to characterize the outcome of national elections based on exit polls, The Associated Press learned Thursday.

A network source involved in the networks' negotiations with the House telecommunications subcommittee on the subject of projections said an announcement would be made in Washington.

The source, who spoke on the condition of remaining anonymous, said that in return the networks received a pledge from the committee that it would consider possible legislation on a 24-hour election day. Such legislation would mandate uniform poll closings throughout the United States, as well.

The agreement was to take immediate effect, the source said.

The source said the networks were concerned that telecommunications subcommittee chair Rep. Tim Wirth, D-Colo., would hold hearings in Western

states that would produce anti-network publicity.

Solon decries fearless thugs

WASHINGTON (AP) — Bernhard Goetz, the man accused of shooting four teen-agers on a New York subway, is a symbol of the criminal justice system's failure to protect people "against thugs and toughs who operate with impunity," Sen. Alfonse D'Amato said Thursday.

The New York Republican said he would be glad to testify on Goetz's behalf that young criminals make the subway a dangerous place, but he added it would be wrong to "condone vigilantism as the answer" to the problem.

"I've been on that subway when three, four and five thugs get on a train. They don't have to threaten you. They are very menacing by their presence and some of them get a kick out of it," D'Amato said at a hearing of the Congressional Crime Caucus.

D'Amato and the caucus chairman, Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., said that solutions to the growing problem of arrogant toughs and career criminals are mandatory jail sentences for serious crimes, and building more prisons.

Ethiopian war hinders relief

WASHINGTON (AP) — Civil war in Ethiopia is threatening the delivery of emergency American aid, and could lead to the starvation of additional millions of Africans, U.S. officials said Thursday.

"The starving people of Ethiopia simply cannot be pawns," said Peter McPherson, administrator of the Agency for International Development.

McPherson and Chester Crocker, assistant secretary for African affairs, testified before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee which held its first hearing under new chair Sen. Richard Lugar, R-Ind.

McPherson said the seizure of an Australian ship carrying 6,000 tons of food by the Ethiopian government was intended to prevent the aid from going to areas where the government does not have full control.

Crocker said a history of bad relations between the United States and the socialist Ethiopian government makes it difficult to bring pressure on the government, to make sure that the internal conflict does not worsen the plight of millions affected by the drought and other causes of the famine.

Meanwhile, Crocker said, many refugees are fleeing Ethiopia to Sudan because they are trying to get away from the fighting and avoid resettlement programs which are affected by political loyalties.
