### 'Dear Abby' donates money

Advice columnist Abigail Van Buren recently donated \$5,000 to the University's journalism school in honor of Robert Lucas, a 1936 University alumnus and long-time friend of "Dear Abby."

Van Buren wrote to Karl Nestvold, acting dean of the journalism school, offering more than advice, making her donation to the school's advancement council, which Lucas chairs. The council was recently formed to seek private support for the school.

Nestvold thinks the money will be used for the news-editorial department because Van Buren's 25-year professional relationship with Lucas began in this area.

Van Buren and Lucas became friends in 1958 when Lucas was managing editor of the Denver Post and the paper began carrying Van Buren's column, then two years old.

Nestvold called the gift "an outstanding kick-off to the efforts of the school's advancement council whose assistance in attracting significant gifts for our program is invaluable."
