Conference to focus on medical self-care

It's not too late to act on those New Year's Resolutions. The second annual Self Health Conference will be going on all day tomorrow in Room 167, EMU. Participants must pick up registration packets at the bookstore prior to the conference. The packets, which cost \$7.50, include information on the various workshops, a workshop selection sheet and a registration card.

Coping with stress, medical self-care and learning effective communication skills will be addressed in three workshops.

"Participants will learn about basic health issues and just how to take care of themselves," says Susan Snyder, director of the Crisis Center.

The first conference session will be devoted to mental health. Participants will choose from topics including stress management, decision making and coping with depression.

The next session will deal with the body. Nutrition, body image, and recognition and prevention of suicide are among topics offered.

Following lunch, the third session will cover interpersonal relationships. Choices include topics such as conflict resolution, self-protection and living with loss and loneliness.

The final session will be a group exercise in relaxation techniques.

University students can receive one pass/no pass credit for the conference.
